The Melchizedek Revelation - The saving of spiritual Truth

For almost 30,000 years after the collapse of the first garden, the religious traditions of Dalamatia and Adam and Eve presisted among the Greeks, Sumerians, and the Hindus. The light of reveiled truth began to dim as the ages passed. By 3,000 B.C., the concept of one God had almost died off the planet. The world had truly entered dark times. It was under these conditions that the heavenly government determined that in order to keep the light of truth burning, an emergency mission to earth by a universe son of God was appropriate. The third epochal revelation on earth began 1, 973 years before the birth of Jesus when Machiventa Melchizedek (just as there are humans and angels, there is a universe order of personalities called Melchizedeks) came to earth on an emergency mission. "Melchizedek had no father or mother and there is no record of any of his ancestors. He was never born and he never died but his life is like that of the Son of God- a priest forever." Heb. 7: 2-3 Machiventa suddenly appeared in the flesh and lived for 93 years in Salem, the city later called Jerusalem. He first appeared unpretentiously as he walked into a herder's tent and proclaimed that he was Melchizedek from the Most High God.

Melchizedek was recorded in the Bible as the King of Salem, from the Most High God. Machiventa appeared fully grown, as a man about six feet tall with a very powerful presence. He spoke six languages and dressed like the Canaanite priests except he wore the three blue concentric circle emblem of the Paradise Trinity on his breast. This symbol had also appeared on the flag of righteousness during the Lucifer rebellion. Unfortunately, Melchizedek's followers believed it so sacred that they never dared to use it.

The Melchizedek Mission

Machiventa had two objectives during his emergency mission on earth. They were:

- To spread the truth of the existence of one God.
- 2. To prepare the way for the son of God to come to earth. As the Bible recorded it "...Christ did not elect himself to the honor of being High Priest; no, he was chosen by God. Melchizedek gathered believers and pupils and organized schools at Salem. The doctrine of one God was emphasized. The cardinal principle of trust and faith in God was stressed as the appropriate response to the goodness of God. Faith, Machiventa taught, was the only requirement for gaining favor with God. The seven commandments established by the Sage of Salem was similar to the commandments of Dalamatia and Eden.

Abraham was an intelligent, organized, effective, honest, wise buisness and military leader. Machiventa established a relationship with Abraham who, after many years of vacillation, was persuaded to curb his military and kingly ambitions for the more spiritual concepts being taught by Melchizedek and his Salem missionaries. Abraham made a covenant with Melchizedek to have faith in the one God, the Most High God. In return, Melchizedek promised Abraham that his children would become dominant in the land. Abraham took this covenant very seriously and fathered a dominant family whose ancestry and might is recorded in the Old Testament. Abraham assumed the civil and military leadership of the Salem colony. By associating with Melchizedek, Abraham had increased his power among the surrounding leaders.

Abraham was a gifted man and Melchizedek chose to appear in Palestine largely because of the opportunity to inter act with Abraham. If it wasn't for opportunity, the revelation might have occurred in India, China, Europe, or Asia Minor. The bet placed on Abraham family payed off.

As a result of Abraham's organizational ability, the Salem temple, the school system, and missionary activities grew. At one time Abraham had 100,000 tithe payers to the Melchizedek brotherhood. Machiventa, after training missionaries, sent them into the world instructing them not to place primary emphasis on reforming the mores or habits of living but to proclaim the good new of faith in one God, El Elyon, the Most High God.

The results of Melchizedek's work

Melchizedek initiated a dynamic outreach organization that was called the Salem missionaries. These teachers proclaimed the truths of one God in the place of many gods as they spread the teachings to the distant corners of the globe. From Lake Van Turkey to India, from Europe to Egypt, the noble gospel of faith in God was spread as a replacement to sacrifices and burnt offerings. This good news spread to many people and had mixed results in its acceptance. In some parts, the teachings were totally accepted, others

The most lasting success for this emergency mission occurred with the followers of Abraham and Moses. The Hebrews accepted the teachings of one God and under the dynamic leadership of Moses, the oppressed tribes of the Hebrews kept these teachings somewhat sacred. Since Melchizedek had come to prepare the way for Jesus, his association with Abraham provided the spiritual continuity that would last until Jesus arrived on earth. The roots of Christian ethics reflect the Hebrew heritage of these teachings. Likewise, Greek philosophy were fundamentally affected by these truths.

But the teachings of Melchizedek can be read in most of the world's important religious texts. His teachings greatly effected Taoism, Hinduism, and Buddhism. For almost 2000 years these noble teachings were widely believed in the thriving Egyptian valley of the Nile and in various Mesopotamian cities. Even Confucian and Shinto teachings were affected by Melchizedek.

Melchizedek leaves earth

After spending ninety-four years spreading the truth of one God throughout the world, Machiventa decided it was time to terminate his emergency mission to Urantia. He had often told his companions that he must leave someday as suddenly as he had appeared. People were beginning to regard him as a demigod and before a personality cult set in, Melchizedek fully trained Abraham to carry on these important activities once he was gone.
