## LIST OF DISAGREEMENTS WITH GARDNER'S URANTIA ARTICLE IN SI

- 1) Lucifer, Caligastia and Beelzebub are angels (the word means messenger) in the Bible, not in UB.
- 2) Adam and Eve did not eat forbidden fruit, that is a Biblical myth not found in UB.
- 3) No where does UB state humans souls are created at birth. At the arrival of the Thought Adjuster, between the ages of 4-6, is more appropriately the birth of the soul.
- 4) UB states that beings are repersonalized, not "reincarnated" from planet to planet. The term "reincarnation" implies repeatedly returning to the same planet, something the UB specifically denies.
- 5) UB states that humans fuse with their Thought Adjusters (the indwelling fragment of God) prior to reaching Paradise, but they do not "fuse with God" as you allude, especially in the sense of a drop of water merging with the ocean. Humans eternally maintain their individuality and identity.
- 6) UB states that Tabamantia and Grandfanda are proper names, not neologisms. And the word is agandonter, not abandonter.
- 7) UB states that Jesus did  $\underline{\text{unintentionally}}$  cause water to turn into wine.
- 8) The way I read the UB, Jesus' body was instantaneously dematerialized where it lay; it was not snatched from the sepulchre, but this appears vague in the text.
- 9) UB does not claim to be channeled, even by current usage of the word. I sent Martin a list (from Sadler) of how it did not arrive, which included all aspects of channeling. All channelers I know of are conscious (or semi-conscious) of their trance-actions and do remember afterwards that they participated in the phenomenon. The subject of the UB's trancemission did not. Other that Martin, I know of no one who purchased the UB as a result of the current channeling craze, as he claims. The UB specifically denies the occult, channeling, reincarnation, spiritualism and many other things that which do attract those types.
- 10) What documentation is offered to support his opinion that Sadler was a strange religionist? Gardner did document that Sadler, Sr., was a prominent psychiatrist, surgeon, author and lecturer. If this is opinion it should so state as Hume looked upon no opinion even as more probable or likely as another. If it is a fact, however, reasoning other that the UB should be submitted to substantiate it.
- 11) Gardner wrote a letter to me stating that he believed neither Sadler nor his wife wrote the book, based on a response from Sherman's wife, and SI has a copy. Why does the article even speculate on something he personally ruled out in personal correspondence?

- 16) As it applies to all theistic life-after-death belief systems, the amount of time of unconciousness between death and repersonalization differs widely. UB states as many as three different time periods for this phenomena, depending on many factors. SDA agrees with only one of these three, contrary to Gardner's statement. From Philosophical Theism to Fundamentalist Christianity--all believe in a God and immortality, even though none agree on the details.
- 17) The sun's outer atmosphere does indeed contains calcium (Space Time Infinity 1985 Smithsonian) and the region between the Sun and the Earth is filled with fragments of the Sun itself (Planet Earth 1983 Bantam).
- 18) In November 1965 three separate theories confirmed what  $\underline{\text{UB}}$  (pg 668) stated from 1933-55 (at a time when it was scienctific suicide to support): The continental drift is a fact.(PE, 1983)  $\underline{\text{SI}}$  stated in print that the staff of Harvard Geology Dept.  $\underline{\text{did}}$  not even teach the plate techtonics until ten years after its worldwide acceptance (1965).
