

REGULATIONS ON THE SELECTION OF A NAME
FOR A URANTIA SOCIETY

In addition to the requirement of the Brotherhood Constitution (V-5.1) that the words "URANTIA Society" shall be a part of the name of a society, further rulings regarding the name have been made by the Charter and Executive Committees, as follows:

1. That every URANTIA Society shall include in its name the location in which the society is formed. This does not mean that the founders must all live within the limits of a certain town or city, but that since the activities of the group will necessarily be centered in a certain locality, the name of that locality will serve as a clear means of identification of the society.
2. When there is more than one society in a town or city, the second one to be established does not have the right to call itself the "first," even though the original society did not use the word "first" in its name.
3. If a society wishes to change its name from that originally selected, the secretary of said society must send a letter to the Charter Committee of the URANTIA Brotherhood, stating the new name of the society and asking approval. With the approval of the Charter Committee and the Executive Committee, the name may be changed and placed on file.
