He came over the other evening for dinner and to see what we are doing and I thought then that you have a real crew of to call on when you need to. He has designed many very complex computers and computer parts and is a true specialist in that field. I call your attention to him as you may want to use his consultant services some day. He was glad to help us and gave us many ideas for improvement. When we complete our first print-out we will of course send you a copy which as you know, will need to be revised in a very short time as people move, marry, die and divorce. What a time the census keepers of the universe must have! I hope they send me on some other types of duties.

I am enclosing a first copy of names and addresses from the Idaho Conference. There are many more as we had 65 present at several meetings where I counted but this doesn't include children and several others. As at Snow Mass many of these people are fairly new readers. I stayed on two days after the conference and met one evening at Boise at a hospital where one or two readers are and they use their meeting room for a study group of about 12. This was a new experience for me and I believe we should explore the possibility of doing more of this.
