Dear 1978 Conference Participant:

On your Conference Registration Form you asked for transportation information. We can now provide the following travel information--specifically from Chicago O'Hare International Airport to George Williams College, on Sunday, August 13, as well as the return to O'Hare on Friday, August 18. We have learned that the regular Greyhound Lines are expensive and also run an indirect route to Williams Bay, involving a changeover at Rockford, Illinois.

Therefore, we have chartered a number of buses from Continental Transportation Company which will both lower the cost and cut the amount of travel time. We plan to stagger bus departures from O'Hare beginning early Sunday, and ending that afternoon after the last of you have arrived. In order to better determine the exact number of buses necessary and the times at which demand will be heaviest, we need your flight information and the number in your party who will be using the bus. Please complete the enclosed form and mail to John Hales at the above address as soon as possible -- and no later than July 20, 1978.

After we have developed an optimal schedule for departures, we will send a letter to all those who have made reservations providing information concerning the times the buses will be leaving. Buses will depart from the two main O'Hare terminals directly outside from the Continental Transportation ticket desks on the lower level (baggage claim area).

For those who wish private limousine service, the charge is between \$40 and \$80 one way for 6 to 9 passengers. If you prefer this more expensive transportation, we ask, due to the complicated logistics involved, that you make your own reservations through the airlines, if they will take care of it, or through your local travel agent.

As concerns the return to O'Hare from George Williams College on Friday, August 18, we will begin departures for the two-hour trip to the airport at about 8:00 A.M. Departure of buses will be dependent upon the flight information you supply. If you have any questions about these arrangements, please do not hesitate to write or call us (312 327-0424). We look forward to seeing you in August.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE LETTER

September 1978

To: General Councilors, Society Presidents,
and Field Representatives

The exhilarating experience of the General Conference at George Williams College along with the feed-back which we have received following the conference suggests that this was probably the most unifying and inspiring group experience in the history of the Brotherhood. We should like to thank all who contributed to its effectiveness and success.

Our General Council meeting was the most open and educational meeting we have ever had. The various issues and problems referred to the Executive Committee for study have been assigned to committees. The General Council, I believe, will assume a larger and more active roll in shaping the policies of URANTIA Brotherhood. This is a healthy development toward developing a broader base of decision-making in the Brotherhood.

As a consequence of the enlightened guidance of the General Council, the Houston society is planning to invite John and me down to meet with their society and explore ways in which they may be able to join with us in supporting the Licensing Agreement.

The Administrative Committee was instructed to work out a letter of agreement for the URANTIA Brotherhood Corporation which would authorize the Corporation to act as the distributor of the Concordex. The agreement will be voted on at the next meeting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

Judith A. Cosky of Clawson, Michigan, William G. Nelson of Flint, Michigan, and Trevor Swadling of Melbourne, Australia, were elected as members-at-large.

The Triennial Delegate Assembly will meet August 17 and 18, 1979.

The First Pacific Conference for Students of The URANTIA Book will be held in Hawaii September 23 to 25. The Kendalls and the Sprungers plan to attend and stay about a week in order to meet with as many individuals and study groups as possible. We are looking forward to a stimulating and rewarding experience in fellowship.

We are enclosing updated lists of the departmental committees and society officers.

As your fall activities get under way, we send you our warm best wishes for a productive and fulfilling year.
