

For the protection of your valuables, we recommend that you utilize a safety deposit box at the Front Desk. There is no fee for this service.

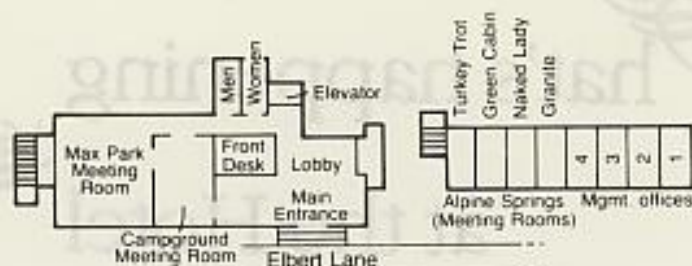
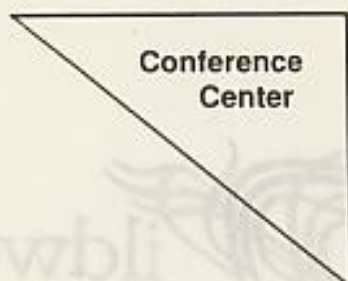
Humidifier rentals are available for \$3.00 per day. See Front Desk or call Ext. 500.

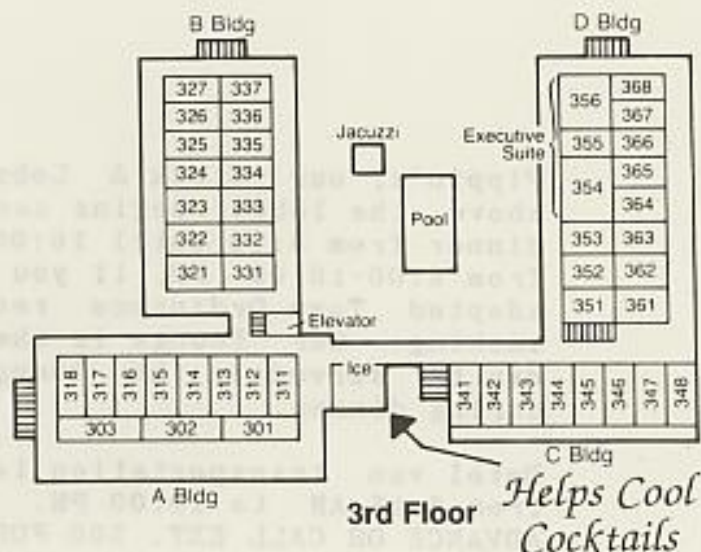
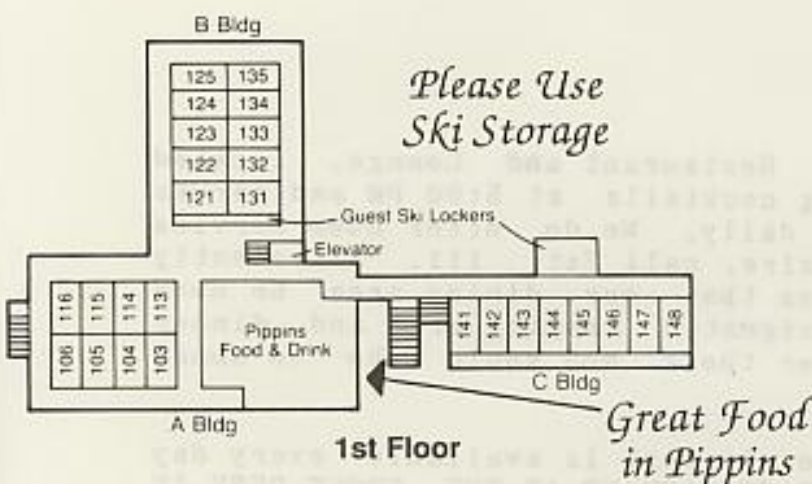
We have an exchange library in the Lobby. Drop off the books you've read for someone else to read and pick up a new one for yourself.
