Dear Paul:

I am certainly interested in the project of Vincent Myers in teaching a course in the URANTIA Book in the Worcester, Massachusetts Evening School. I am glad to know that you and John Hales are planning to meet with them so that they don't go off at a tangent which we have found some people tend to do.

As I read the proposed outline I am reminded of several things. When I first started to develop a course in SCIENCE IN THE URANTIA BOOK I wanted to start with the study of Reality but I decided that I would not attempt to include it since this is a big and complex study in itself. I am also reminded that we spent two full days in considering the five epochal revelations during a summer study session a little over a year ago.

As I read through the other topics in the outline I can't help but question whether this isn't many times too much for any one course. I can see that this could be just a skeleton of these teachings but then I question whether there can be any depth in the topics that would be covered. Some of the topics could be handled in a survey in an evening of 2½ hours, such as Nos. 8, 4, and possibly 7, but when I see the topic 9 I realize that this is essentially what is covered in the whole of Part 4 in the URANTIA Book.

What I am trying to tell you, Paul, is that I believe that Mr. Myers is exceedingly ambitious in what he is trying to do, and would recommend that he either spread out some of these topics or select more limited ones that can be presented in an evening. I wish him success in whatever he does in this night school class.

Now about the questions relative to Marian's comments about membership-at-large. It is true that we do not advertise the membership-at-large aspect of the Brotherhood, but certainly when our Field Representatives and other established Urantians know of individuals who might be appropriate candidates for this recognition we would not want to withhold information about membership-at-large. The concern of some is that many people just like to become "joiners" and I think that is what Marian had in mind. Certainly if you would recommend some-body such as Mrs. Varnum and Mr. Scalzo we would be happy to consider these people for this status.
