

MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE
OF URANTIA BROTHERHOOD

March 7, 1960

The regular meeting of the Executive Committee was held at 8:00 P.M., March 7, 1960, at 533 Diversey Parkway, Chicago 14, Illinois.

Russell W. Bucklin, William M. Hales, James C. Mills, Sylvia B. Sunderland, and Leone M. Sadler were absent. The meeting was called to order by Warren H. Kulieke with Marian Rowley acting as Secretary.

The minutes of the last meeting held on February 1, 1960, were read and approved. Upon motion duly made, seconded, and unanimously carried, the meeting recessed for an informal discussion.

This informal discussion is summarized as follows:

Mr. Farwell reported that the Domestic Extension Committee had not held a meeting, but the statement of what we expect of a local society would be revised and it was agreed that a copy of the constitution and by-law references of requirements of a society should be attached to the statement.

Dr. Sadler reported that the matter of teaching aids which had been brought up in one of the reports from the field representative had been considered by the Committee on Education. The committee felt that the textbooks prepared for use in the school and the diagrams and charts now being prepared represented all that they could recommend at present and would suffice until the correspondence school is started.

The Chairman presented a letter from Dr. Meredith J. Sprunger suggesting that he would be available in September to visit the Oklahoma and West Coast societies if we would like him to. The matter was thoroughly discussed and it was agreed that it would be very valuable to have one more personal contact with these groups and the meetings should prove beneficial both to the groups and to Dr. Sprunger. Formal action was deferred.

Miss Rowley read Mr. Mills' report of his recent interview with Winston Ross, former secretary to Sir Hubert Wilkins, which primarily concerned the forthcoming book about Sir Hubert.
