# PORTRAITS

## DUANE AND LUCILE FAW BY DICK MAC DONALD



When Duane and Lucile are asked how and where they first met, usually a bit of good humor comes into play. They met in college, in a debate class, but their relationship of many years has not been a continuing practice of what they learned in debate class. Duane and Lucile are prime examples of a marriage that is a working team and illustrate very clearly that unity with diversity, well modulated with harmony, can be a powerful and effective means to the attainment of any goal.

In their URANTIA work they have always maintained this complimentary balance by working in different areas of the movement but always being supportive of each other; Duane by working at the national level as a member of the Executive Committee and Chairman of the Judicial Committee, and Lucile working at the local level where she has served as President of the First URANTIA Society of Los Angeles (FUSLA) and a member of many hard working committees. She recently became a member of URANTIA Brotherhood's Charter Committee.

Duane has had a brilliant and exciting career. Born in Loraine, Texas, raised in Denton, Texas, he was graduated from high school and from North State College at Denton. Subsequently he earned his degree of Juris Doctor from Columbia University.

Duane is also a man of action. Answering his country's call to arms he served as a combat pilot flying SPD dive-bombers through 79 missions in the southwest pacific -- Guadalcanal, Bougainville, Rabaul and many other areas.

With the outbreak of war again in the early 1950s, Duane became Wing Legal Officer in Korea, Japan, and Okinawa where he served during the Korean war. He later became active in other areas as a Commander of Marine expeditionary forces.

Because of his outstanding military service and his status as a Professor of Law,

Duane was called to Washington where for three (3) years he performed as special advisor, on policy and legislative matters, to the Commandant of the Marine Corps.

In Vietnam he served as Deputy-Chief of Staff of I C O R for thirteen months, after which he returned to the States and sat as a judge for the Court of Military Review for one year. Duane then became the first Marine to be promoted to the rank of General to head up all Marine Corps lawyers. He functioned in the capacity for two years, subsequently retiring from the Service in August of 1971.

After such a career, he obviously was not going to be inactive very long. The very next day in fact, he laughingly stated, he went to work at Pepperdine College where he still teaches today as a Professor of Law.

But that is not the bottom line!! In 1972 Duane found The URANTIA Book. Then he really got busy for this was the beginning of a new career. In the years to follow he became a devoted student of the URANTIA teachings. He attended many conferences where he made outstanding presentations which revealed his deep insight into the contents of the Book. He has conducted many workshops and his ability as a public speaker as well as an advisor, is well known.

When asked what his greatest goal in life is, he stated simply, "Service in doing the Will of the Father wherever I am and needed." Duane and his wife Lucile have devoted more time and energy to the URANTIA movement than will ever be known.

Lucile plays a strong supporting role in their teamwork, in a way that does not diminish her own creativity and leadership capability.

Lucile was also born and educated in Texas. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree and started for a Masters, but as she puts it, "I was sidetracked by our marriage and found myself earning another kind of a degree -- raising our three daughters and a son." But even so, she became a teacher and taught economics at college level.

Lucile became interested in the URANTIA teachings in 1973 through Duane's encouragement. She has now been a student for nine years and became a member of the First URANTIA Society of Los Angeles. In time she was elected President. Her term of office finished in 1981, and she is now working in other areas of URANTIA activities.

She and Duane share alike the desire to see more and more URANTIA Societies founded; for they feel that through this activity, leadership is fostered and this is what is needed as the URANTIA movement matures.

Aside from her accomplishments as a wife, mother and homemaker, Lucile has been very successful as an agent in real estate. She points out with some interest that nearly everyone in her office became a reader of The URANTIA Book, which she states with a smile, "Sort of makes it another study group."

Some of Lucile's other activities reveal her as an active, well balanced person with many civic interests. She served as a volunteer worker for twenty years on the Governing Committee of the Navy Relief Society at their headquarters in Washington. She has also been a bowling coach; a program director in bowling activities; a Girl Scout Leader and a Cub Scout Den Mother. Her hobbies and interests are much the same as her husbands -- bowling, fishing, traveling, reading and teaching.

As a Faw team, their latest adventure will be a combined experience which will take them to England where Duane will be teaching at Notre Dame until sometime in December. We are happy to know they will be returning home by the end of this year.

Getting to know the Faws is a wonderful experience, and one of the most delightful things about this lovable couple is the ease with which it can be done.

# SPOTLIGHT ON SPIRIT

## IN THE SPIRIT OF WORLD PEACE

"With scientific progress, wars are going to become more and more devastating until they become almost racially suicidal. How many world wars must be fought and how many leagues of nations must fail before men will be willing to establish the government of mankind and begin to enjoy the blessings of permanent peace and thrive on the tranquility of good will – world-wide good will – among men?" \*(p.1490)

Sunday, June 6, 1982, was a momentous day in URANTIA's recent history. All across the United States hundreds and thousands of people gathered together in many different cities to make a fervent plea for world peace. Here in southern California at the Rose Bowl, an estimated 85,000 - 100,000 people prayed together, led by leaders of all this world's major religions, for close to a half hour before sharing in a program of speakers and music that lasted nearly twelve hours.

This was the largest anti-war gathering this country has seen since the Vietnam era. The most obvious difference between then and now was the presence of people from virtually every walk of life, and every faith. As one speaker put it, "Then we thought we could end a war on our own - and we did. But now, we want to end all war and we've asked GOD to join us." An early follower of Dr. Martin Luther King, Dr. James M. Lawson, Jr. now a leader in the United Methodist Church repeated King's words, echoed many times throughout the afternoon, "We have a dream. . ." and surprised quite a few of us there when he said, "The torch that was carried by one is now passed on to many." Stevie Wonder, one of the many performers donating their energies, also moved the crowd's collective spirit proclaiming, "We are all soldiers for peace."

And Peace Sunday was just the beginning. Less than a week later, nearly a quarter of a million people marched together in New York City, through the heart of Manhattan, proclaiming the same message. Their march ended in Central Park where they heard many of the same speakers and performers Los Angeles had so warmly embraced the week before. On Monday the peace espousing New Yorkers surrounded the United Nations as it went into General Assembly.

The message is quite clear: no more war. The people have expressed their desires and now expect the worlds unevolved governments to answer. But what a hopeless task it seems to be.

"It is not a question of armaments or disarmament. Neither does the question of conscription or voluntary military service enter into these problems of maintaining world-wide peace. If you take every form of modern mechanical armaments and all types of explosives away from strong nations, they will fight with fists, stones, and clubs as long as they cling to their delusions of the divine right of national sovereignty." \*(p. 1490-1)

Peace Sunday seems to represent the dawning of 'world consciousness' and the desire of Urantians for the realization of the brotherhood of Man under the fatherhood of God. We are beginning to realize that we are all truly brothers, that we want to live on a planet that is safe for our children, and that it will be impossible to achieve this while many governments are fighting for so much and leaving many with so little.

"The political sovereignty of representative mankind government will bring lasting peace on earth, and the spiritual brotherhood of man will forever insure good will among all men. And there is no other way whereby peace on earth and good will among men can be realized." \*(p.1491)
