MINUTES OF DECEMBER 9, 1984 MEETING

Induction of New Members:

Rick Goebel and Carol Setters were inducted into the Society by Jeanette Guimond.

Old Business:

Treasurer's Report - Paula reported that \$700 in dues is still not paid for 1984. She will send a letter reminding unpaid members. A suggestion was made that dues be lowered for 1985. The Coordinating Committee will discuss this suggestion before making their recommendation at the February 2 meeting. A balance of \$21,453 remains in the treasury.

Vice President's Report - Mo pointed out that eight new members have joined the society in 1984 and predicted that new members will continue to accrue naturally as long as the Society continues to accomplish beneficial functions.

Outreach Report - Don Guimond summarized outreach activities for 1984. The booth was set up at four fairs including the Capitol Hill People's Fair. It was also set up on the Boulder Mall four days and as a regular part of the Urantia Book Club activities in the Student Union of CU. Approximately 195 booth hours and 550 man/woman hours were volunteered in staffing these booths. Attendance at the four fairs approximated 375,000 people, with at least 105,000 seeing the booth and URANTIA Book. More than 2,100 people stopped to talk; 2,400 pamphlets were distributed; 16 phone calls resulted; 23 names were added to the mailing list; 14 copies of the URANTIA Book were loaned and 35 copies were sold; and 4,000 cups of free water were given away. A telephone line was installed with listings throughout the state inviting calls for information about the URANTIA Book.

The URANTIA Book Club sold 29 books and enrolled 35 members in its first 13 weeks of existence.

A one-hour interview on the University of Colorado radio station was broadcast to the entire campus. Don Guimond has taped copies of the interview available for anyone who would like to hear it. He suggests that it can be used in conjunction with introducing new readers to the book. He has sent several copies of the tape to members of other URANTIA Societies, with enthusiastic feedback.
