January 17 & 18

"THE ART OF TEACHING IN PARABLES" by Errol and Rochelle Strider.

The how, what, and why of parables. The Striders will discuss the significance of parables, how to create some of our own, and how to develop awareness for truth demonstration. They will explore the different styles of parables, including humor, drama, stories for children and adults, characters, poems, and multimedia.

ERROL and ROCHELLE STRIDER, Boulder residents and long-time Urantia Book readers, have been doing creative ministry for over ten years. They share teachings with schools, universities, and churches across the country. Errol wrote three books of parables for spiritual growth, and has written filmstrips on faith, spiritual values, and the life and work of Paul.

January 31 & February 1

"THE RELIGION OF JESUS - A QUANTUM LEAP" by Bill and Kaye Cooper.

Knowing God as our Father and loving men and women as our brothers and sisters seems to be the essence of the gospel of Jesus. The Coopers will explore the importance and the process of coming to experience God, not just knowing about him. They will also demonstrate that love of others must be expressed in terms of service, that "service is love in action".

BILL and KAYE COOPER of Arlington, Texas, are well known to perhaps most of the Urantia readers around the country. Through the years they have given exciting presentations at many Urantia conferences. They founded and continue in the publication of the Dallas-based Urantia periodical, The Circles. Spiritual guidance in discerning God's will has been their special long-time interest.



March 7 & 8

"BUILDING A PHILOSOPHY OF LIVING" by Jeff Wattles.

"The religious challenge of this age is to those far-seeing and forward-looking men and women of spiritual insight who will dare to construct a new and appealing philosophy of living out of the enlarged and exquisitely integrated modern concepts of cosmic truth, universe beauty, and divine goodness" (U.B.p.43).

Jeff will present a survey of the best thinkers on the philosophy of living, and offer an approach to building bridges between planetary philosophers and the teaching of the Urantia Book. Taking note that "so few persons on Urantia take delight in cultivating...qualities of courageous and independent cosmic thinking", Jeff will give particular emphasis to the Golden Rule and its practical application.

DR. JEFFREY WATTLES, a doctor in philosophy, teaches ethics at the University of Santa Clara, California. He is also presently assisting in offering a course on the Golden Rule at Stanford University - perhaps the first college course of its kind. A long-time student of the Urantia Book, he has made presentations on the philosophy of living at a number of churches and conferences. He has written a soon-to-be-published book "How to Build a Philosophy of Living".
