## GENERAL INFORMATION

This Gathering will consist of related group studies reaching for experiential understanding that we may receive from such activities.

Friday July 27, check in begins 2PM - Wine and Bread reception at 7PM.

Saturday July 28 - Morning study groups will be on THE MORTAL CAREER OF JESUS (papers 120-134). Afternoon study groups will be on THE PUBLIC WORK OF JESUS AS THE SON OF MAN (papers 135-156). The multi-media presentation "JESUS: God and Man", part one, is part of the evening program.

Sunday July 29 - Morning worship at the Carillion Tower, then Diversion and Relaxation until mid afternoon (see Pg. 1610 The URANTIA Book). Then a forum on the Foundation, Brotherhood, Societies and Study Groups, concluding with an evening program including slides of The Holy Land.

Monday July 30 - Morning study groups will be on THE PUBLIC WORK OF JESUS AS THE SON OF GOD (papers 157-187). Afternoon study groups will be on THE POST MORTAL CAREER OF JESUS (papers 188-196). Part two and the finale of "JESUS: God and Man" is a segment of the evening program.

Tuesday July 31 - Morning only from 9AM to High Noon. This will be an ad-hoc forum designed to give us historical information about the revelation and some insight into the future of the revelation, with the objective of better equipping us, as individuals and groups, to make the best possible decisions regarding present action.

Other Presentations - Music, Speakers, Art, Poetry and two extra Multi-Media.

Detailed outline of program will be sent when we receive your registration.



CHILDREN - Child care has been arranged for day sessions at no charge and will be provided at a nominal fee for evenings. Children age four and up will be in the care of our Children's Committee, who will be teaching and training them during the day to participate in the evening sessions. We are hopeful that this Gathering will direct TRUTH, BEAUTY and GOODNESS to our children in this, "Year of the Child".



ACCOMMODATIONS - The "Walter Gage Residence" will be used for this Gathering. For room reservations please mail the enclosed "Reservation Card" to U.B.C. Conference Centre, see address on card. All reservations should be made no later than 30 days prior to the Gathering.

Please state on the U.B.C. Reservation Card, the number of persons arriving, e.g. Single (1), Adults (2), Family (Adults 2-Children 3).

Payment will be made to the U.B.C. Conference Centre at the time of your arrival. Do Not send money in advance. If you plan to come early or stay later than the Gathering dates, the same rates will apply.

Rates per day for 1979 - Adult in single room \$12.00, Husband & Wife in single rooms \$21.00, Children under 12 yrs. \$6.00, Youth under 19 yrs. \$8.50. Suites are, one person \$24.00, two persons \$31.00. Plus 5% tax on all rooms.



HABITATION - The Gage Residence's north tower and low rise building will be used for our Gathering. On each floor of the tower (see diagram) there are four living units, each containing six single bedrooms, combination bathroom, lounge with refrigerator and balcony. In the low rise there are a number of deluxe suites with twin bedded bedrooms, lounge with refrigerator and bathroom. The kitchenettes are not supplied with dishes, etc. and stoves are not in service. All rooms are with towels and bedding. Sorry, no pets please.

SUSTENANCE - There is a cafeteria style dining room across the court from the Gage Residence. It serves both light snacks and full meals on an a la carte basis from 7AM to 7PM.

TRANSPORTATION - Free shuttle service is provided to and from U.B.C. at points of arrival and departure. For information see registration form.

REGISTRATION - Fees cover costs for meeting rooms, theater, printed material, mailings and refreshments. Cancellation refund of 80% until June 30th only.






