NORTHWEST CONFERENCE FOR STUDENTS OF The URANTIA Book

Warm Beach Camp and Conference Center is located seven miles north and 12 miles west of Everett, Washington on a high bluff overlooking Puget Sound. This area was the ancient route for Pacific-bound icebergs. (The URANTIA Book, Page 700A). The camp lies between Warm Beach and Stanwood. (See map)

It has trails and developed play areas which provide not only beauty, but relaxation and opportunities for peaceful communion with God. Its 300 acres, many still in their natural wooded state, are provided by our Father. Prepare for a calm walk alone with God in the grandeur of His creation and for a program of spiritual challenge that will send you forth with a dynamic answer for this age, revealed in the lives of families and individuals who will meet at Warm Beach Camp.

Our theme is: "REACHING IN / REACHING OUT". Going forward, revealing the Father to others through our own transformed personalities, we may all the better understand "Cosmic Dimensional Performance" by learning from each other the great work of revealing truth, beauty and goodness!

HERE ARE THE DETAILS:

Registration and Check-in / Check-out. The conference begins with check-in in the Cedar Lodge lobby. (See map) Check-in begins on Sunday, August 17th, 5:00 pm. Then we'll have a late Dinner beginning at 7:00 pm. (Sunday check-in only. For regular meal hours, see below.) Check-out time is no later than 2:00 pm. or after lunch, Wednesday, Aug. 20th.

NOTE: ALL CONFEREES MUST BE REGISTERED BY MAIL IN ADVANCE!!! This is because our agreement with the Camp requires an accurate forecast of attendees. Unregistered latecomers can only be accommodated if there are last minute cancellations. You must enclose a cheque or money order for the full amount.

All payments are 100% refundable up to July 10th, 1986. After July 10th, no refunds can be made, unless, perchance, a latecomer takes your place.

What to bring. Dress casually, and bring a warm jacket and be prepared for rain. Shoes and shirts are compulsory in the dining room. Don't forget your URANTIA Book, and you may want a notebook too. A camera and sport clothes for recreational activities is also recommended. All bedding and towels are provided for those staying in lodges, or you may bring your own linen and towels for a discount! (See registration form.)

Food Service. All meals will be served family-style (served from the table). Promptness to meals is therefore essential for best food quality, the Dining Room doors will be closed 20 minutes after posted meal times. Meal hours are: Breakfast, 8:00 am, Lunch, 12:00 noon, and Dinner, 5:30 pm. We ask that you do not take food from the dining room. Vending machines are available for snack type foods

ACCOMMODATIONS. All rates are minimum Double Occupancy and include three meals daily. (NOTE: ALL PRICES HEREIN ARE QUOTED IN U.S. FUNDS)

Olympic View Lodge. \$95.00 per adult for three nights, linens included. All rooms with private bath. Will sleep four to a room as a family. (Children's rates on reg. form). Two common rooms with a fireplace are available for those late night conversations about our unseen friends.

Cascadian Lodge. \$71.00 per adult for three nights, no linens included in price. See registration form for information. Bath down the hall. Will take up to three adults to a room. A large common meeting room with fireplace is also available for get-togethers.

Mt. Baker Cabins. \$71.00 per person for three nights, no linens included. Cabins are fourplex with each two rooms sharing a bath. Will accommodate up to five in a room. Suitable for families. All beds are single and rooms are carpeted.

Recreational Vehicle Site. (No meals are included in rates). \$15.00 per site plus \$15.75 per adult for three nights. 130 sites available in a park-like setting. Water and electricity included to most, sewer to 25. Outdoor kitchen cookhouse and covered tables are also available. (See maps)

Tent site. \$9.00 per site plus \$15.75 per adult for three nights, no meals in these rates. (See maps for lay-out and information).

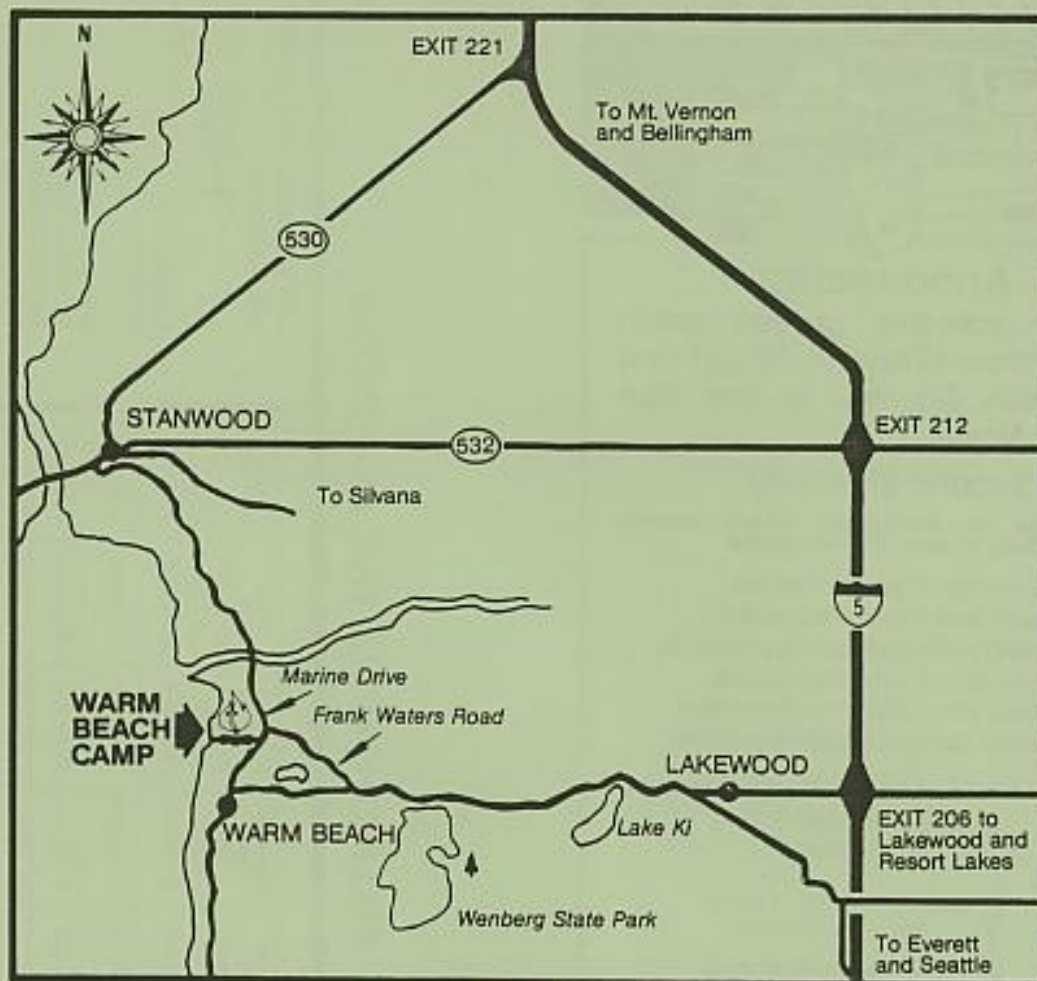

APPENDIX 5

RECREATION SERVICES

Effective January 1985

1. HORSEBACK RIDES (Available all year; Rides scheduled on the hour at 1, 2, 3, and 4 p.m.)

\$3.25 per 40-minute trail ride. Children under 7 must ride with an adult and both riders must purchase a ticket.

Tickets are purchased at the RECEPTIONIST OFFICE by 10:00 a.m. on the day of the ride. NO REFUNDS are given on horseback rides.

2. PONY CARTS (Available all year)

\$30 for one hour. Warm Beach Camp will provide driver and tours.

Advance arrangements must be made with the Recreation Services Director.

Rides will be scheduled on the hour. Cart will hold approximately 15 people.

3. SWIMMING POOL (Available May 1 - September 30 between 1 and 4 p.m.)

Use of the pool is open to all Guest Groups on the grounds during the hours designated by Warm Beach Camp. The pool is included as part of the facility use fee.

4. MINIATURE GOLF Available May 1 - September 30 between 1 and 4 p.m.)

The Miniature golf course is available during the WINTER (October-April) by advance request with a \$10.00 guaranteed minimum to open the course.

During the SUMMER (May-September) the course will be open all afternoon.

There are 18 holes with a cost of 75¢ per person.

5. CANOES (Available May 1 - September 30, tides permitting)

Canoes are rented at \$3.75 per canoe, per hour. Tickets are purchased at the RECEPTIONIST OFFICE by 10:00 a.m. on the day of rental.

Canoes are made for 2 people each; A minimum of 5 canoes must be rented per scheduled hour. NO REFUNDS are given on tickets purchased.

The Recreation Services Director will schedule canoes during high tides and post information.

Paddles, life jackets and lifeguard will be provided by Warm Beach Camp.

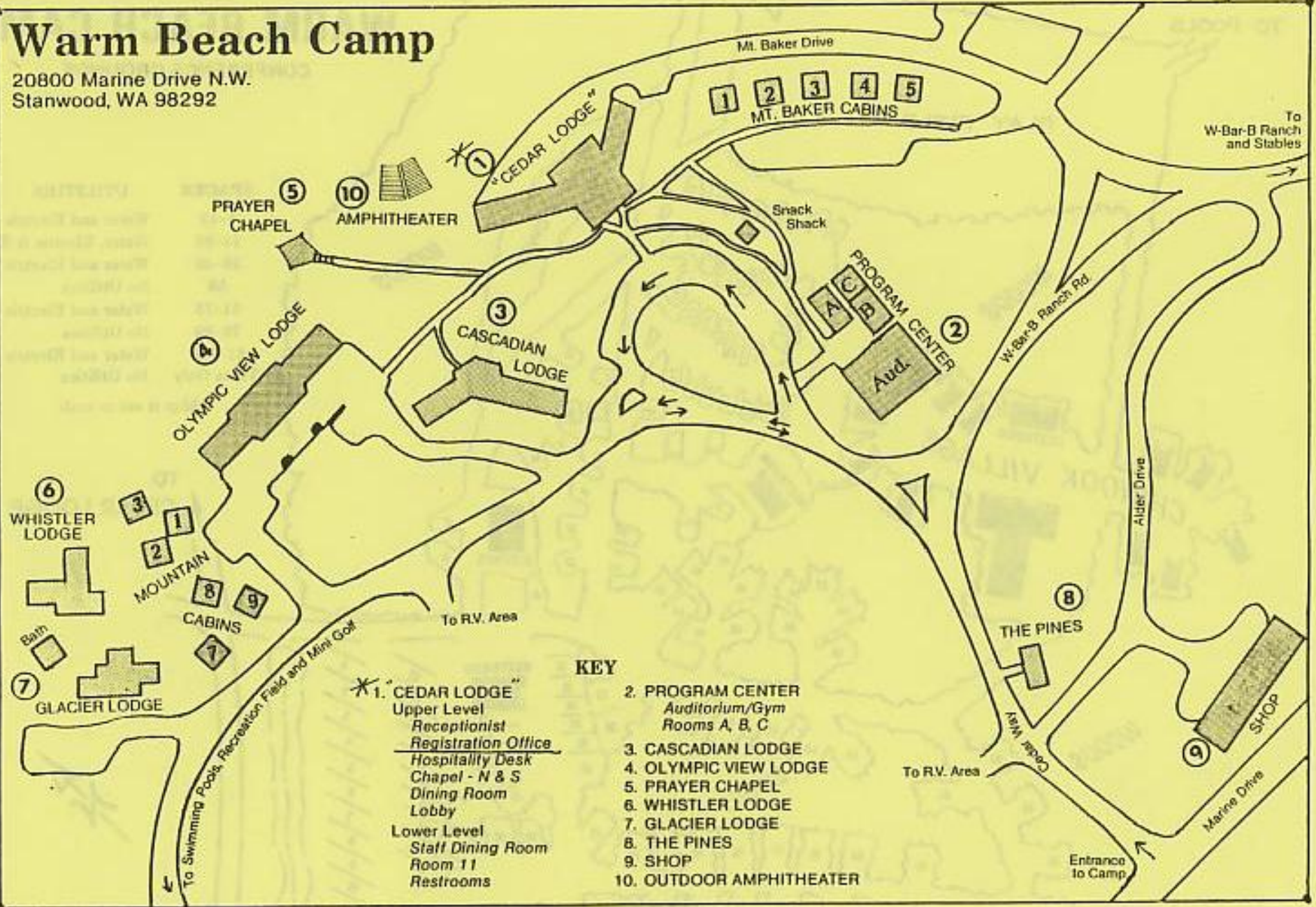

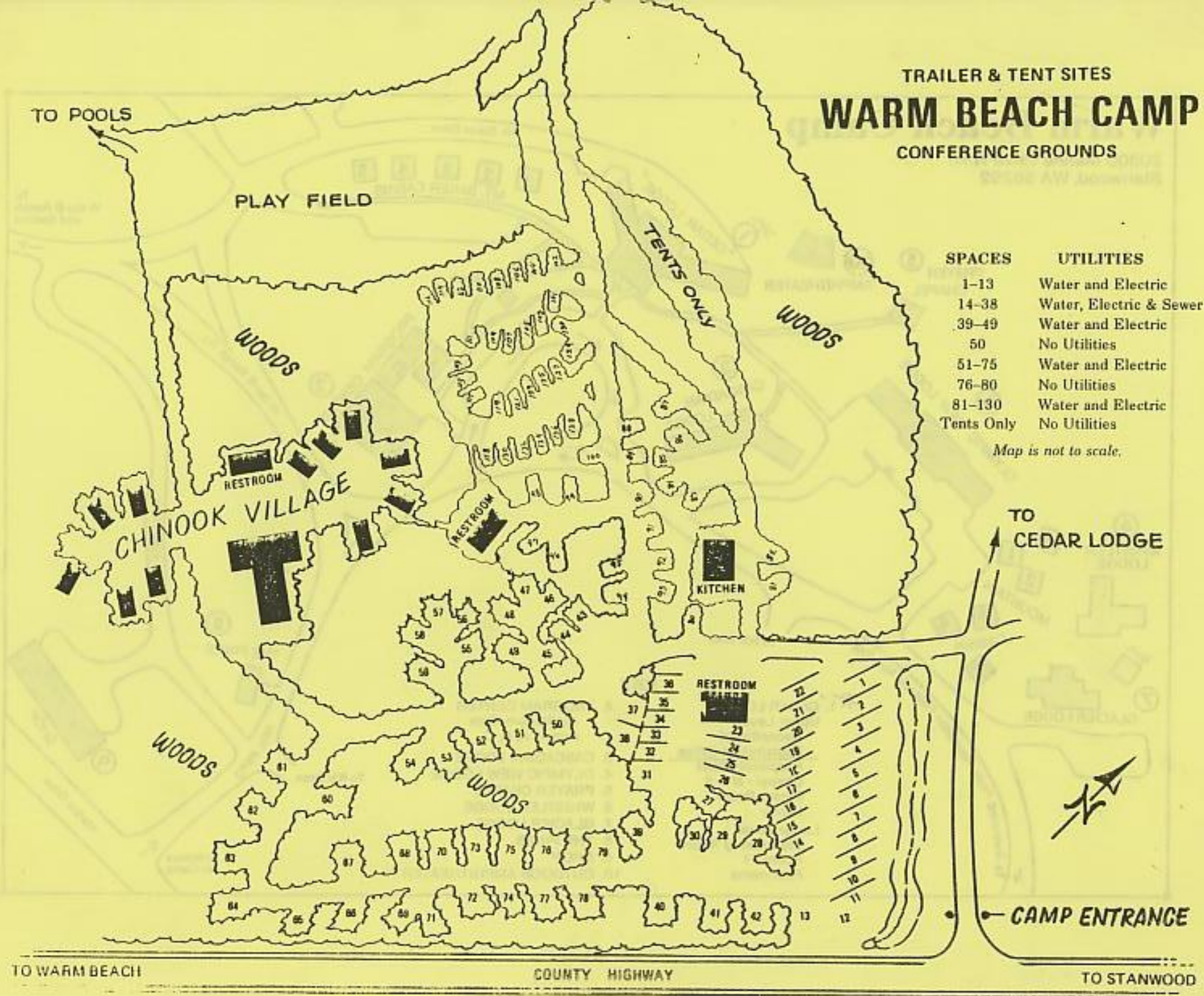

CONFERENCE CHILDCARE INFORMATION & REGISTRATION

The Oregon Family of Urantia Book Students is organizing the children's program for the Northwest Regional Conference 1986. We would like to present both education based on Urantia Book teachings, as well as childcare, for children two and over.

Facilities offer a fully equipped nursery complete with cribs, toys, play pens, restroom, cupboards and a fenced in play area outside. Recreational facilities include swimming pools, horseback riding, and miniature golf for older youngsters. (See Appendix 5 for recreation services).

Children will be divided into age groups. The children's program will coincide with adult workshops. Organized and supervised activities are planned for teenagers. Children under two will need to be cared for by parents.
