

WHAT EVER HAPPENED TO...?



PROCULA

CLAUDIA PROCULA, the wife of Pilate learned about the gospel from her maid-in-waiting, a Phoenician believer. After the death of Pilate, Claudia became outstandingly identified with the spread of the religion of Jesus.

PONTIUS PILATE was finally deposed when a false Messiah led troops to Mount Gerizim, where he claimed temple vessels were buried. When he failed to reveal the hiding place of these vessels as promised, bloody riots broke out. In connection with this incident, Pilate ordered a senseless slaughter of Samaritans and was ordered to Rome by the legates of Syria. Tiberius died while Pilate was en route, and he was not reappointed as procurator of Judea. Pilate never really recovered from the condemnation resulting from his consenting to have Jesus crucified. Out of favor, he retired to the province of Lausanne where he subsequently committed suicide.

THE ROMAN CENTURION who arrested and later crucified Jesus became a Christian and subsequently came into full fellowship in the kingdom of heaven on earth. He later related the happenings of the crucifixion to Luke.

MARY the mother of Jesus returned to Bethsaida after the events of the crucifixion and the Pentecost, where she lived in the house of John Zebedee. Mary lived less than a year after the death of Jesus.

JERUSALEM, the City of Zion erupted in violence in 66 A.D. The Roman Garrison was massacred and a revolt spread across the country. The Romans lay siege to the city and in 70 A.D. the Romans leveled the city, spelling the end to the ancient Hebrew state. All Golgotha was covered with thousands upon thousands of crosses upon which, from day to day, the flower of the Jewish race perished. The Jewish dream of an independent political state was not realized again for nineteen centuries when the republic of Israel was proclaimed in 1948.

ANDREW left Jerusalem when persecutions scattered the apostles. He won many souls to the kingdom in Armenia, Asia Minor and Macedonia. He was crucified in Patrae in Achaia. He lived for two full days on the cross and he continued to proclaim the gospel to his last breath.

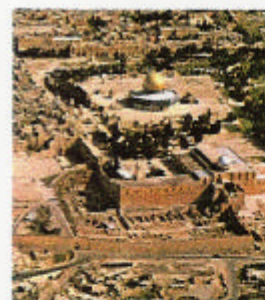
