January - in The Earth Life of Jesus

Though the coldest month of the year (averaging a mild 50 degree Fahrenheit) in the Nazareth Region, flowers could be seen blooming by the end of the month (Page 1367).

January A.D. 1 Early this month - during his seventh year - there occurred the heaviest snowstorm Jesus experienced in his lifetime, nearly two feet (Page 1361).

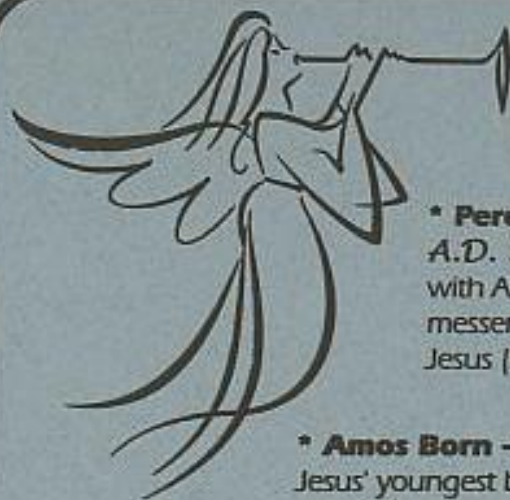
January A.D. 2 During this month, he spent a week on an uncle's farm; his first stay there since infancy (Page 1364).

January A.D. 21 Jesus left his family one raining January morning, never to return as a regular household member (Page 1419).

January A.D. 26 In early January, after working several months as a boatbuilder in the Zebedee family workshop, Jesus laid aside his tools and said: "My hour has come." (Page 1495).

January A.D. 30

- By the middle of January, over 1200 people had gathered at Pella (Page 1817).
- As this January drew to a close, nearly 3,000 people were gathered at the Pella camp to hear Jesus preach. (Page 1819).



January Important Events

- **Perean Mission - January 3, A.D. 30** The Perean mission began with Abner giving final instructions to the messengers; and was the last ministry for Jesus (Page 1817).
- **Amos Born - January 9 of A.D. 7** Amos, Jesus' youngest brother, was born (Page 1373).
- **John Executed - January 10, A.D. 28** John the Baptist was executed (Page 1627).
- **Discussion - January 12, A.D. 26** Jesus' brothers, James and Jude, talked with him about meeting John the Baptist (Page 1503).
- **Ordained - January 12, A.D. 27** Jesus ordained the 12 apostles as ambassadors of the kingdom and preachers of the gospel (Page 1547 and 1568).
- **Told of Death - January 12, A.D. 28** John's disciples told Jesus of John's death (Page 1627).
- **Leave for Pella - January 13, A.D. 26** Jesus, James and Jude left for Pella to where John was baptizing (Page 1504).
- **Capernaum - January 13, A.D. 28** Jesus, the Apostles, and 25 of John's disciples went to Capernaum (Page 1627 - 1628).
- **Jesus Baptized - January 14, A.D. 26** Jesus was baptized (Page 1504).
- **Conferences - January 16, A.D. 29** Abner and the apostles of John met with the apostles of Jesus in Bethsaida for a regular series of conferences. Also, on this date, Jesus made one of his most profound statements, saying he would commission 10 women to teach the gospel (later adding two more - Mary Magdalene and Rebecca) (page 1678).
- **3rd Tour - January 18, A.D. 29** The 24 apostles, plus 75 tested evangelists, prepared for the 3rd preaching tour of Galilee (Page 1678).
- **Passover - January 19, A.D. 27** Jesus and the Apostles traveled to Jerusalem for the Passover (Page 1587).
- **Galilee - January 28, A.D. 28** On this Sunday, Jesus, the Apostles, and the disciples of John began the first preaching tour of Galilee (Page 1637).
- **3,000 - January 28, A.D. 30** Jesus preached to the 3,000 on "Trust and Spiritual Preparedness" (Page 1819).

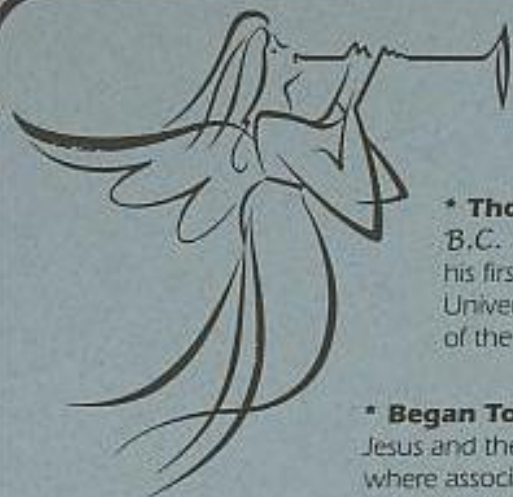
February in The Earth Life of Jesus

Although Palestine was usually cooled by westerly winds during February (and March) hot winds occasionally blew in from the east (Page 1361 & 1367).

February, 7 B.C. Six months after her visitation from Gabriel, Elizabeth (the mother of John the Baptist) shared this event with Jesus' mother Mary (Page 1345).

February, A.D. 2 Nahor, a rabbi from the Jerusalem academy, came to Nazareth to observe Jesus, then advised Joseph and Mary to permit Jesus to go to the Hebrew learning center - but Jesus eventually declined (Page 1365).

February, A.D. 7 By the middle of this month, in his 13th year, Jesus became sure of his mission on earth (Page 1373).



February Important Events

• **Thought Adjuster** - February 11, 2 B.C. Jesus' Thought Adjuster arrived, after his first moral decision; at the same time, the Universe Rulers withdrew their guardianship of the incarnated Michael (Page 1357).

• **Began Tour** - February 11, A.D. 30 Jesus and the 12 began a tour of northern Perea, where associates of Abner and members of the women's corps were also working (Page 1825).

• **Hands** - February 18, A.D. 30 Jesus shocked Nathaniel, the Pharisee, and his guests by not washing his hands before the breakfast prepared in his honor (Page 1825).

• **Ended Tour** - February 20, A.D. 30 Jesus and the Apostles ended their tour of northern Perea (Page 1825).

• **Arrived Philadelphia** - February 22, A.D. 30 Jesus and ten of the Apostles arrived in Philadelphia with over 600 followers, while Andrew and Peter remained in Pella teaching (Page 1833).

• **Called "Son"** - February 23, A.D. 26 John the Baptist and his disciples, from their camp on the Jordan River, saw Jesus coming in from the north and referred to him as "The Son of God" (Page 1505 & 1506).

• **Farewell to John** - February 24, A.D. 26 On this morning, on the Jordan River near Pella, Jesus left John the Baptist; and the two never again met in the flesh (Page 1505 & 1526).

• **Return to Jordan** - February 26, A.D. 27 Jesus and the Apostles returned to the Jordan River near Bethany in Perea to teach and preach the gospel for four weeks (Page 1593).

• **Lazarus sick** - February 26, A.D. 30 Jesus received word that his friend, Lazarus, was sick and near death (Page 1836).

March in The Earth Life of Jesus

Fine sand, carried by the hot winds from the eastern desert, occasionally blasted the Palestine region during the month of March (February and April) (Page 1361).

March, 8 B.C. Joseph and Mary were married this month; the same month Caesar Augustus declared that a census would be made for better taxation (Page 1350).

March, A.D. 22 In his 28th year, Jesus left the Zebedee boatshop and Capernaum to spend the passover with his earth family in Jerusalem (Page 1421).

March, A.D. 24 Simon and Jude, in a double wedding, were married with Jesus' blessing; only baby Ruth remained unmarried (Page 1484).

March, A.D. 25 John the Baptist began his short but great career as a preacher, sweeping aside his doubts and proclaiming the Kingdom of God (Page 1499).

March, A.D. 25 John the Baptist headed up the Jordan River to establish his camp at the ford opposite Jericho; the same place were the children of Israel first passed when coming to the promise land (Page 1501).

March, A.D. 26 This was the first of four months Jesus used for teaching the original six Apostles and his bother James about the Kingdom (Page 1533). On the last day of the month, Jesus and the Apostles traveled to Jerusalem from the hills of Jericho (Page 1595).



March Important Events

• **Appearance - March 2, A.D. 26** On this Sabbath, Jesus was in the Capernaum synagogue for this first public appearance since baptism (Page 1532).

• **John saddened - March 3, A.D. 26** John the Baptist, after parting with Jesus for the last time, headed south feeling sad and confused; recognizing his work in the flesh was nearly over (Page 1506).

• **Assembling - March 4, A.D. 29** Before continuing their third preaching tour, it was prearranged that Jesus, the Apostles, evangelists, and the women's corps would assemble in Nazareth (Page 1683).

• **Last week - March 6, A.D. 30** Jesus and the Apostles began their last week at Camp Pella (Page 1850).

• **Tour ended - March 10, A.D. 29** The third preaching tour ended on a serious and somber note with a gathering at Bethsaida (Page 1687 & 1688).

• **Last Pella Sermon - March 11, A.D. 30** Jesus preached his last sermon at Pella.

• **Left Pella - March 13, A.D. 30** Jesus and The Twelve left Camp Pella heading south to Perea (Page 1868).

• **Closed Pella - March 15, A.D. 30** David Zebedee closed the visitor's camp at Pella (Page 1868).

• **Joseph Born - March 16, A.D. 1** Joseph, Jesus' third sibling, was born (Page 1361).

• **Tour ended - March 17, A.D. 28** The first preaching tour of Galilee ended in Capernaum (Page 1637 & 1647).

• **Completed Training - March 20, A.D. 7** Jesus completed his training in the school associated with the Nazareth Synagogue and became "A son of the commandant" (Page 1373).

• **John Born - March 25, 7 B.C.** John the Baptist was born (Page 1346 & 1496).

• **Rest - March 27, A.D. 29** Jesus sought to escape the multitudes by resting at a beautiful park near Bethsaida-Julias; just prior to the feeding of the 5,000 (Page 1700).

• **Livias - March 29, A.D. 30** Jesus and his followers camped at Livias after Perea (Page 1871).

• **Passover - March 30, A.D. 28** Going by way of the Jordan Valley, Jesus and the Apostles went to Jerusalem for Passover (Page 1648).

• **Walls - March 30, A.D. 30** Along with about 200 followers, Jesus and the Apostles reached the walls of Jericho (Page 1873).

• **Bethany - March 31, A.D. 30** Jesus and the twelve Apostles arrived at Bethany (Page 1878).



April 1995

April in The Earth Life of Jesus

April was one of the months (along with March) in which fine sand was blown through the air by hot winds in the region where Jesus lived as a child (Page 1361). It is also the month the rainy season ended and the Palestine area was covered with flowers (Page 1367).

April A.D. 25 By mid-April of his 31st year, Jesus left Nazareth for Tyre, thereby ending his world travels, with the exception of a later trip to Syria (Page 1492).

April A.D. 26 The 2nd of four months Jesus used to train the first six Apostles - and brother James - as they tarried in Galilee (Page 1533).

April A.D. 27

- Jesus and the 12 made their journey to Jerusalem, marking the first occasion when all 12 were there together (Page 1595).
- Jesus and the 12 attended the Passover feast in Jerusalem (Page 1587).
- Jesus and the 12 worked in Jerusalem by day, and spent the nights at Bethany (Page 1596).
- By April's end, the Pharisees and Saducees' opposition to Jesus had grown so great, the 13 decided to go south to Bethlehem and Hebron (Page 1605).

April A.D. 28 During the last week of this month, Jesus and the Apostles left their headquarters at Bethany to begin the return trip to Capernaum (Page 1653).

April Important Events

- **Caravan - April 1, A.D. 24** Jesus left Nazareth to lead a caravan in the Caspian Sea region. The trip lasted a full year (Page 1484).
- **April 1, A.D. 25** Jesus arrived in Capernaum, ending his experience as a caravan conductor (Page 1485).
- **James Born - April 2, 3 B.C.** James, Jesus' first brother, was born (Page 1357).
- **Trip - April 2, A.D. 28** Jesus and the Apostles made an uneventful trip to Jerusalem but multitudes came to Jesus in Bethany to be healed. (Page 1648).
- **Left Bethsaida - April 3, A.D. 29** After feeding the 5,000, Jesus and the Apostles left Bethsaida for Jerusalem; but did no preaching (Page 1706).
- **Visit w/ Messenger - April 4, A.D. 7** It was a Monday, as he neared his 13th birthday, that Mary and Joseph departed with Jesus for his first ever trip to Jerusalem. Arriving on Friday, it was one of the most extraordinary days in the mortal life of Jesus; a day that ended with a visitation of a messenger from Saivington stating the hour had come for him to be about his Father's business - effectively ending the first stage of his human life. (page 1374-76).
- **Sanhedrin - April 4, A.D. 30** The Sanhedrin resolved to bring about the death of Jesus and Lazarus (Page 1909).
- **Lazarus - April 6, A.D. 29** They arrived at Bethany, and spent the night at the home of Lazarus (Page 1706).
- **Crucified - April 7, A.D. 30** Jesus was betrayed, arrested, judged, crucified and gave up his life - all before 3:00 p.m. this day (Pages 1973, 2011).
- **Passover - April 9, A.D. 7** Jesus' first Passover in Jerusalem for his 13th birthday (Page 1374).
- **1st Appearance - April 9, A.D. 30** The personality and morontia form of Jesus resurrected from the burial tomb, and made the 1st of 19 appearances (throughout the next 39 days) (Page 2020 - 2021).
- **10th Appearance - April 11, A.D. 30** Jesus made his 10th appearance in the morontia form, at Philadelphia, to over 150 humans (Page 2041).
- **Simon Born - April 14 A.D. 2** Jesus' 3rd brother was born (Page 1365).
- **3rd Stage - April 14, A.D. 30** Jesus achieved the 3rd stage of morontia progression (Page 2041).
- **11th Appearance - April 15, A.D. 30** The Apostles Peter and John found Thomas around the hills of Olivet, and led him to the home of John Mark in time for Jesus' 11th appearance the next day (Page 2042).
- **Ruth Born - April 17, A.D. 9** Jesus's last sibling, baby Ruth, was born (Page 1389).
- **12th Appearance - April 18, A.D. 30** Jesus made the 12th appearance to Rodan and 80 other believers at Alexandria (Page 2044).
- **13th Appearance - April 21, A.D. 30** Jesus made his 13th appearance, by the Sea of Galilee, and consulted with the Apostles two-by-two (Page 2045).
- **14th Appearance - April 22, A.D. 30** Jesus made his 14th appearance on the hill near Capernaum with the eleven apostles and re-enacted the ordination scene (Page 2041).
- **Bethsaida - April 24, A.D. 29** Jesus and the Apostles left Jerusalem for Bethsaida; by way of the coast cities (Page 1706).
- They arrived in Bethsaida; and Jesus requested permission to speak in the Capernaum synogogue knowing this would be the last time he would be permitted to do so (Page 1706).
- **Tour - April 26, A.D. 22** Jesus left Jerusalem with Gonod and Ganid for a 20 month tour of the Mediterranean basin. (Page 1427).
- **15th Appearance - April 29, A.D. 30** Jesus made his 15th appearance near the seaside at Bethsaida, as over 500 believers came to hear Peter preach (Page 2050).
- **Comfort - April 30, A.D. 29** After the masses deserted them, Jesus spoke words of comfort and courage to the Apostles (Page 1717).
- **Departure - April 30, A.D. 30** The Apostles departed Bethsaida for Jerusalem, teaching and preaching along the way (Page 2051).

May, A.D. 2 Jesus experienced his first fishing trip on the Sea of Galilee at the age of eight (Page 1364).

May, A.D. 3 Jesus experienced his first harvesting of the grain on his uncle's farm (Page 1367).

May, A.D. 5 When 11 years old, he went with Joseph on a business trip to Decapolis in Greece and saw the annual competitive games; perturbing Joseph with his enthusiasm (Page 1370).

May, A.D. 25 Shortly after John the Baptist began to preach, the priests and Levites wanted to know if he was the Messiah (Page 1502).

May, A.D. 26 May was the third of four months Jesus used for intense training for the original six Apostles; plus his brother, James (Page 1533).

May, A.D. 27 Jesus and the Apostles spent the entire month of May doing personal ministry in Bethlehem, Hebron, and the surrounding villages; making visits house-to-house (Page 1605).

Jesus made 19 appearances after the crucifixion:

1st resurrection appearance: April 9, A.D. 30 (Page 2021)

19th resurrection appearance: May 18, A.D. 30 (Pages 2055 - 2057)



May Important Events

- **Spies** - May 1, A.D. 28 Jesus and 12 began their return trip to Capernaum from Jerusalem after the Pharisees' spies accused them of breaking Sabbath (Page 1654).
- **Preparation** - May 1, A.D. 29 Jesus held intimate counsel with the Apostles and trusted disciples through May 7th, preparing them for the difficulties ahead (Page 1717).

• **7th Stage** - May 2, A.D. 30 Jesus achieved the 7th stage morontia progressor (Page 2041).

• **Bethsuids** - May 3, A.D. 28 Jesus and the 12 arrived in Bethsuids by boat from Traichea to avoid the throngs and spies (Page 1655).

• **Zebedee Home** - May 3, A.D. 28 For the next five months (through October 3rd), Jesus and the 12 lived in the Zebedee home and trained evangelists (Page 1657).

• **Death** - May 3, A.D. 30 The 11 Apostles arrived at the home of John Mark just shortly after the death of John Mark's father (Page 2041).

• **16th Appearance** - May 5, A.D. 30 Jesus made his 16th morontia appearance in the courtyard of Nicodemus (Page 2052).

• **Jerusem citizenship** - May 7, A.D. 30 Jesus achieved Jerusem citizenship (Page 2041).

• **Lowest ebb** - May 7, A.D. 29 Jesus held the last seaside meeting on this Sabbath; at the time when the popular support for him and his teaching was at the lowest ebb (Page 1718).

• **Forbidding** - May 8, A.D. 29 The Sanhedrin issued a decree forbidding Jesus and his followers from all Palestinian synagogues (Page 1718).

• **17th Appearance** - May 13, A.D. 30 Jesus made his 17th appearance to Nalda and 75 Samaritians near Jacob's well at Sychar (Page 2053).

• **Entered Most Highs** - May 14, A.D. 30 Jesus entered the embrace of the Most Highs on Edentia (Page 2041).

• **Refused** - May 16, A.D. 29 After the second-Tiberias conference between religious and political leaders, Herod and the political leaders refused to order Jesus' arrest (Page 1719).

• **18th Appearance** - May 16, A.D. 30 Jesus made his 18th morontia appearance at Tyre (Page 2054).

• **Charges** - May 18, A.D. 29 Herod agreed to the Sanhedrin plan to have Jesus brought to Jerusalem on religious charges (Page 1719).

• **19th Appearance** - May 18, A.D. 30 Jesus made his 19th (and final) appearance as a morontia personality to the 11 Apostles at John Mark's home as they sat down for breakfast; afterwards, he led them to Mount Olivet, and, after saying goodbye to them, disappeared from sight and began his ascent to receive the confirmation of the Universal Father as Sovereign of Nebadon (Page 2055 to 2057).

• **Signed decree** - May 21, A.D. 29 Herod signed the decree for the Sanhedrin to seize Jesus and try him for flouting the sacred Jewish law (Page 1719).

• **Impending arrest** - May 22, A.D. 29 Jesus got word of his impending arrest, gave farewell instructions to his disciples, gave a parting address to over 100 believers; and then his earth family arrived in the mist of his parting address, but he left without seeing them, and went by boat to the eastern shore of the Sea of Galilee near Kheresa (Pages 1720 - 1723).

• **Chorazin** - May 23, A.D. 29 Jesus instructed Peter to go to Chorazin with 12 evangelists; where they preached in adversity for two weeks (Page 1726).

• **Caesarea-Philippi** - May 24, A.D. 29 Jesus and the remaining 11 Apostles arrived in Caesarea-Philippi (Page 1726).

• **Star** - May 29, 7 B.C. An unusual conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn occurred in the constellation Pisces; adding to the legend of the Star of Bethlehem (Page 1352).

June in the Earth Life of Jesus

June 8 B.C. It was near the end of June when Gabriel appeared to Elizabeth to announce she would bear a son - John - as the forerunner to the deliverer (Page 1345).

June 1 B.C. The biggest event of John the Baptists' childhood was when he and his family visited Jesus and the Nazareth family (Page 1496).

- Joseph made the transition from carpenter to building contractor, greatly uplifting the economics of his family (Page 1360).

June A.D. 3 When Jesus was nine years old, he and Joseph climbed Mount Tabor (Page 1367).

June A.D. 18 Jesus graciously refused a position as a religious teacher, offered by a group of prominent Alexanderian Jews (Page 1413, 1414).

June A.D. 26 John the Baptist returned to Bethany Ford after verbally attacking Herod for unlawfully taking another man's wife (Page 1506).

- This was the last of four months Jesus spend with the first six Apostles (and his brother, James) preparing them for their future work (Page 1533).

June A.D. 27 Jesus and the Apostles returned to Jerusalem because most of the agitation against him had subsided (Page 1605).

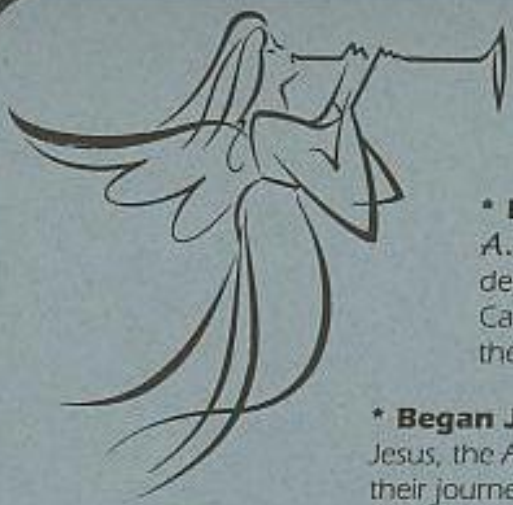
- They spend the entire month in and around Jerusalem with no teaching or preaching, living in their tents at Gethsamane (Page 1606).

- During the last days of June, a Sanhedrin named Simond publicly accepted Jesus' teachings; while Jesus and the Apostles moved on to Samaria and Decapolis because of renewed agitation against them (Page 1606 & 1607).

June A.D. 29 The day after arriving in Sidon, the Apostles and the evangelists were in meditation, reflecting on Jesus' discourse of religion (Page 1734).

June A.D. 30 The June following the crucifixion, baby Ruth was married to David Zebedee (Page 2031).

June Important Events



* **Departed Chorazin** - June 7 A.D. 29 Peter and his associated departed Chorazin for Caesarea-Philippi to join Jesus and the other apostles (Page 1726).

* **Began Journey** - June 9 A.D. 29 Jesus, the Apostles, and 12 evangelists began their journey to the Phoenician coast (Page 1728).

* **Arrived Sidon** - June 10 A.D. 29 They all arrived in Sidon to begin two & one-half weeks of preaching and teaching (Page 1734).

* **John's Arrest** - June 12 A.D. 26 Herod places John the Baptist under arrest (Page 1506).

* **"Hour Has Come"** - June 18 A.D. 26 After hearing of John's arrest, Jesus laid down his carpenter's tools and declared, "The Father's hour has come." (Page 1535).

* **Jesus Spoke** - June 22 A.D. 26 Just before the first preaching tour, and ten days after John the Baptist's imprisonment, Jesus spoke at the synogogue for the second time since making his headquarters in Capernaum (Page 1535).

* **Select Candidate** - June 23 A.D. 26 Jesus instructed the six Apostles to each select one candidate for apostieship (Page 1538).

* **Jude Born** - June 24 A.D. 5 Jesus' brother, Jude, was born after a complicated birthing (Page 1370).

* **Left Sidon** - June 28 A.D. 29 Jesus, the Apostles and the evangelists left Sidon, heading up the coast to Porphyreon and Heldua (Page 1736).

July, 3 B.C. Mary bundled up her two children (Jesus and James), and fled south to her brothers' farm because of an outbreak of an intestinal disease in their town (Page 1357).

July A.D. 1 Jesus experienced the only accident of his young life when he fell down the outside stone stairs of the bedroom rooftop during an unexpected July sandstorm (Page 1361).

July A.D. 12 Zacharias, father of John the Baptist, died after a long illness (Page 1497).

July A.D. 27 This last week of July, Jesus and the Apostles departed Samaria for two Greek cities near the Jordan (Page 1607).

July Important Events



• **True Nature** - July 5, A.D. 4 Jesus first gave expression to those thoughts and feelings regarding the true nature of his personality, character, and mission on earth (Page 1368).

• **Sidon** - July 6, A.D. 29 Jesus and the Apostles returned to Sidon where they stayed for several days before departing for Tyre (Page 1737).

• **Mariam Born** - July 11, A.D. 1 Jesus' sister, Mariam was born (Page 1357).

• **Tyre** - July 11, A.D. 29 Jesus and the Apostles arrived in Tyre and taught for 13 days (Page 1737).

• **Influenced Manufacturers** - July 20, A.D. 29 This was the only day Jesus taught in Tyre; but greatly influenced many of the manufacturers of the world famous Tyrian purple dye with his teachings, and they consequently carried this message with them in their worldwide search for new shellfish habitats (Page 1739).

• **Ended Tyre Teaching** - July 24, A.D. 29 The Apostles and evangelists ended their teaching in Tyre; afterward, Jesus and the Apostles went south down the coast to Ptolemais (Page 1741).

• **Peter Spoke** - July 25, A.D. 29 Peter spoke to the people of Ptolemais this evening (Page 1741).



August 1995

August in The Earth Life of Jesus

August, along with July, were the two hottest months of the year in Nazareth; getting up to 90 degrees Fahrenheit (Page 1367).

August, 4 B.C. Late this month, Joseph and Mary left Alexandria with Jesus, by boat, arriving in Joppa (Page 1358).

August, 2 B.C. Jesus was 5 years old, and for the next 5 years became one constant question mark (Page 1358).

August, A.D. 1 Jesus eagerly began his formal education in the synagogue school at Nazareth at age 7 (Page 1362).

August, A.D. 4 By the time he was 10 years, Jesus had entered the school for the more advanced children in the synagogue (Page 1368).

August, A.D. 9 Jesus was to begin studying in Jerusalem this year, but didn't because of the death of Joseph (Page 1387 - 1388).

August, A.D. 25 Near the middle of this month, Jesus began his 5 week stay on Mount Hermon (Page 1492).

- During the last 3 weeks of August (and the first two week of September), Jesus achieved the first psychic circle, won sovereignty of Nebadon, and ended the Lucifer rebellion / Caligastia secession (Page 1493-94).

August, A.D. 26 Near the middle of the month the Apostles went out on their first preaching and teaching assignment; traveling two-by-two, with Jesus spending time with each pair (Page 1545).

August, A.D. 27 The first half of the month the Apostles made their headquarters in Greek cities, and had their first experience preaching to gatherings of only gentiles (Page 1607).

- The second half of the month they camped on Mount Gerizim teaching the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man to Samaritans (Page 1616).

August Important Events

• **Returned from Phoenicia - August 1, A.D. 29** Jesus returned from the Phoenician mission to reorganize his tested but depleted followers; and to prepare for this last year in the flesh (Page 1742).

• **Sent Word - August 7, A.D. 29** Before leaving for Caesare-Philippi, Jesus sent word to his earth family to meet him at the Zebedee boathouse; but they were unable to do so because of the close scrutiny of the Pharisees (Page 1743).

• **Magadan Park - August 8, A.D. 29** While encamped in Magadan Park, Jesus spoke to over 100 evangelists, believers, and members of the women's corps about the kingdom; while several Pharisees attempted to verbally entrap him (Page 1744).

• **4th Phase of Ministry - August 12, A.D. 29** Early this morning Jesus asked the Apostles to prepare for the journey to Mount Hermon for the inauguration of the fourth phase of his ministry as the Son of God (Page 1751). - By sundown, they had arrived at the foot of Mount Hermon; where they spend two days in spiritual preparation for the coming events (Page 1752).

• **Decided to Continue - August 15, A.D. 29** Jesus consulted with many celestial personalities - including Gabriel and Father Melchizedek - before deciding to continue his mortal life to its natural end (Page 1753).

• **Elizabeth Died - August 17, A.D. 22** Elizabeth, mother of John the Baptist, died suddenly (Page 1499).

• **Directed Apostles - August 18, A.D. 29** Jesus directed that each of the Apostles should associated himself with one of the 12 evangelist groups and go preaching in the cities of Decapolis (Page 1762).

• **Trip to Bethlehem - August 18, 7 B.C.** Joseph and the pregnant Mary began their trip to Bethlehem for the purpose of conforming to the Roman decree that all inhabitants be numbered; for reasons of census and better taxation (Page 1350). **August 19** Joseph and Mary continued their travels; having lunch at the foot of Mount Sartaba, then reaching Jericho by night (Page 1351). **August 20** Joseph and Mary reaching Jerusalem by noon of this day; arriving in Bethlehem by mid-day (Page 1351).

• **Jesus was Born - August 21, 7 B.C.** Jesus was born at noon on this day (Page 1351 - 52).

• **Education Turned Over - August 21, 2 B.C.** Jesus' education was officially turned over from Mary to Joseph. (page 1358).



September 1995

September in The Earth Life of Jesus

September of 4 B.C. Joseph and Mary arrived from Alexandria with baby Jesus, and went straight to Bethlehem and spent the entire month discussing with friends and relatives the wisdom of returning to Nazareth (1356).

September of A.D. 12 Jesus and John spent the entire month together, and would not see each other again until the Baptism (1400, 1497).

September of A.D. 25 Jesus achieved the first psychic circle, became assured of his nature, settled the Lucifer rebellion, and achieved full sovereignty of Nebadon during the last three weeks of August and the first three weeks of September while on Mount Hermon (1493-94).

September of A.D. 27

- September and October were spent on the slopes of Mount Gilboa in seclusion (1617).
- Jesus spent the entire month with only the apostles, teaching them the gospel (1617).
- The apostles spent these weeks reflecting on their experiences since being called into the service of the kingdom by Jesus (1618).
- Prayer and worship was the central theme of the teaching for the entire month (1618).

September Important Events

• **Martha Born** - *September 13 of A.D. 3* Birth of Martha, 2nd sister of Jesus (Page 1367).

• **Return from tour** - *September 16 of A.D. 29* The date Jesus chose for the apostle and evangelist to return from their tour of Decapolis after a month of preaching and teaching in groups of 13 - 12 evangelists and one Apostle (Page 1762).

• After a moderately successful tour of Decapolis, the entire corps assembled at Magadan Park (Page 1771).

• **Week of Rest** - *September 18 of A.D. 29* Andrew announced a week of rest for the apostles, but Nathaniel and Thomas chose to visit with Rodan of Alexandria who had come to Magadan hoping to talk with Jesus (Page 1772).

• **Death of Joseph** - *September 25 of A.D. 8* Joseph died in a construction accident; Jesus was 14 years old (Page 1388).

• **Feast** - *September 25 of A.D. 29* Jesus made a surprise announcement of their travels to Jerusalem for the feast of tabernacles (Page 1783)

• **Star** - *September 29 of 7 B.C.* An Unusual conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn in the constellation of Pisces on this date - as well as on May 29 and December 5 - gave rise to the story of the star of Bethlehem (Page 1352).

October, 6 B.C. In mid-October, Herod gave orders to kill all baby boys under the age of 2 because of his fears about the birth of a new "king of the Jews" (Page 1354).

October, 4 B.C. Early this month, Joseph and Mary left Bethlehem with Jesus for Nazareth (Page 1356).

October, A.D. 9 At age 15, Jesus wrote "The Lord's Prayer" on a smooth board with a piece of charcoal (Page 1389).

October, A. D. 11 Tiberius Caesar had gold coins struck to honor the beginning of his reign; the same year Jesus made his memorable statement: "Money cannot love."; at age 17 (Page 1512).

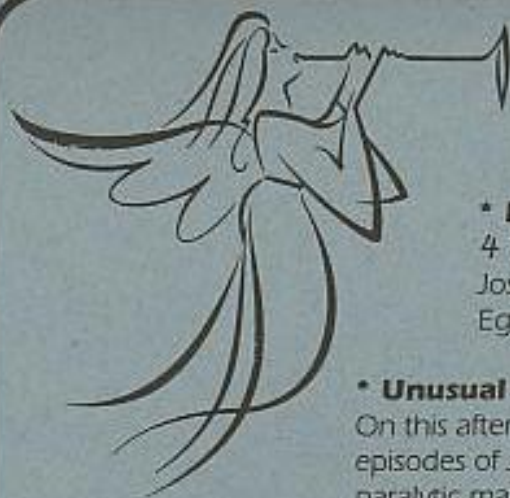
October, A.D. 21 Jesus returned to Nazareth for Martha's wedding (Page 1420).

• **Mary Convinced** - *October 1, 4 B. C.* Mary was convinced by Joseph to return to Nazareth from Egypt (Page 1356).

• **Unusual Healing** - *October 1, A.D. 28*
On this afternoon, one of the most unusual episodes of Jesus' life occurred when a paralytic man was lowered with ropes tied to a couch through loosened tiles in the roof, in front of Jesus as he was teaching; asking to be healed - and he was (Page 1666-67).

• **End of Tent City** - *October 3, A.D. 28* Jesus and the Apostles ended a 5 month residency at the home of Zebedee at Bethsaida where they taught hundreds in a nearby tented city (Page 1657).

• **Tour Begins** - *October 3, A.D. 28* On this same day, the 2nd preaching tour of Galilee began, and continued until the end of this year (Page 1668).

• **Period of Rest Ends** - *October 30, A.D. 29* Jesus and the Apostles ended their period of rest and seclusion in Dephram, and went on to the Madagen Camp (Page 1798-99).

November, 8 B. C. Gabriel appeared to Mary near the middle of the month to tell her she would have a child of destiny (Page 1346).

November, A.D. 20 Jesus attended the double wedding of his brother James to Esta, and his sister Miriam to Jacob (Page 1418).

November, A.D. 27 Jesus and the 24 Apostles quietly taught the Gospel in the cities of the Decapolis (Page 1626).

November, A.D. 29 Earlier this month, Abner and his fellow 11 cast their lot with Jesus, and labored on behalf of the Kingdom right on to the Crucifixion (Page 1798).

November, A. D. 29 The last 10 days of this month, Jesus was in council at Magadan with the recently ordained 70 teachers who were about to go forth to proclaim the gospel (Page 1806).



November Important Events

• **Working Together** - November 2, A. D. 27 Jesus and the Apostles, along with the Apostles of John the Baptist, broke their Gilboa camp to work together, 2 1/2 months before John's execution (Page 1626).

• **Ephraim Arrival** - November 2, A.D. 29 Jesus and the Apostles arrived in Magadan Park from the city of Ephraim, after several days travel by way of the Jordan highway (Page 1798).

• **Instructing Teachers** - November 4, A.D. 29 Jesus began instructing the recently chosen 70 teachers at Magadan (Page 1800).

• **Instructions Ended** - November 19, A.D. 29 Jesus ended these regular instructions to the 70 (Page 1800).

• **Teachers Ordained** - November 19, A.D. 29 On this same day, Jesus ordained these 70 teachers and preachers, with Abner as their leader (Page 1800).

• **Abner Dies** - November 21, A.D. 74 Abner died of old age in Philadelphia at the age of 89; a faithful believer to the end of his early life (Page 1832).

December in The Earth Life of Jesus

It was the rainy season in the Nazareth region (Page 1367). December 25 is the day of the Mithras annual festival of sacrament (Page 1082).

December A.D. 18 James met privately with Jesus to request marriage to Esta, a local Nazarite; and permission was granted provided James would first train brother Joseph to assume the family leadership (Page 1414).

December A.D. 23 Later this month, Jesus returned to Babylon by way of Ur, and joined a desert caravan to Damascus (Page 1483).

December A.D. 25 John the Baptist was near Pella in his travels up the Jordan; where James and John Zebedee were then baptized (Page 1503).

December A.D. 27

- Jesus, his Apostles, and the Apostles of John taught quietly in the Decapolis cities of Scythopolis; Gerasa, Abila, and Gadara (Page 1626).
- Near the end of this month, Jesus and the 24 Apostles began to teach and preach near the Jordan, close to Pella (Page 1626).



December Important Events

• **Amos Dies** - December 3, A.D. 12 Jesus' brother, Amos, died after a week of high fever; at five years and eleven months of age (Page 1400).

• **Conjunction Occurs** - December 5, 7 B.C. A conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn in the Constellation of Pisces occurred; adding to the legend of the star of Bethlehem (Page 1352).

• **Headquarters Moved** - December 6, A.D. 29 Jesus and the Apostles, and nearly 300 believers began moving their headquarters to Pella, near where Jesus was baptized on the Jordan (Page 1806).

• **Jesus leaves Friends From India** - December 10, A.D. 23 Jesus bid farewell to Gonod and Ganid in Charax on the Persian Gulf, after nearly a year and a half with these natives of India (Page 1427).

• **Hospitality Camp** - December 18, A.D. 29 David Zebedee, with his corps of messengers, set up a hospitality camp a mile and a half north of the apostolic headquarters near Pella (Page 1806).

• **Preaching Tour Ends** - December 30, A.D. 28 Jesus, the Apostles, 117 evangelists, and other believers completed their second public preaching tour of Gallilee (Page 1668).

• **Messengers Sent** - Andrew, after consulting with Jesus and Peter, instructed David to send messengers to all preaching groups to be returned to Bethsaida by December 30 (Page 1677).

• **Disciples Ordained** - December 30, A.D. 29 Under the leadership of Abner, 70 ordained disciples concluded a 6-week teaching tour; going 2-by-2, then returning to Pella.

• **Stories Told** - The evening meal was delayed more than an hour as Jesus listened to the Apostles and evangelists relate their enthusiastic stories. (Page 1806).



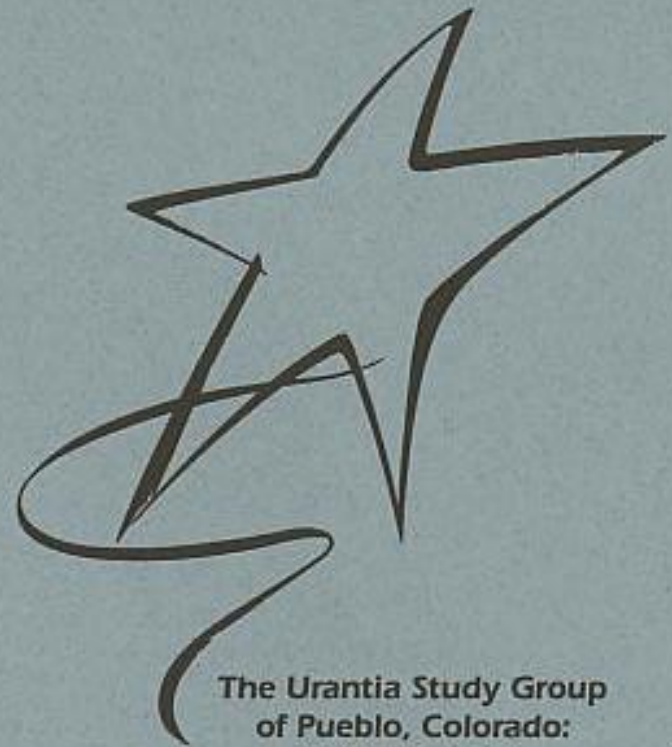
