FUSLA Meeting Feb. 3, 1974

Topic: Spirit Avenues to Communicating Our Faith

1. How beneficial is it to separate and understand the nature of the various spirit forces, since we are told they work together within us ?
2. Full development in each phase of adjutant spirit influence does not appear to be necessary before receptivity to the next phase appears. Could acceptance of this belief be an aid to communication between humans - for example, might an appeal to the spirit of courage in a person be ineffective if development in this phase is relatively small?

Do you think it possible for a person to be highly developed in the spirit of worship with relatively low development in the preceding spirit phases?

3. Read and discuss the last two paragraphs on the bottom of page 1141. Is this a good description of a life that is well-balanced?  
Is this a broad, universal assumption that could serve as a basis for communicating with people of every background?
4. Would improving our individual spiritual communication such as in worship and prayer, help us in our human-relation techniques as well? In what way?

To whom do you address your prayers?

Could we assume that the rules that apply for effective praying, also apply to effective fellowship with our brothers?

5. On page 62, par. 1 there is a reference to personal "inner experience." Exactly on a daily basis, what is this experience and how do you relate this to a hungry, searching soul?
