This documentary illustrates a series of events planned and executed by contemporary poet Paul Fericano. Combining photography, humor and graphics, "Sinatra" is designed to address both the poet's colleagues specifically and a general audience as well. (3 projectors, Composer 301, 13½ minutes)

Face It Karl Recn "Face It" explores facial expressions as a mirror of human emotions. Karl has extensive photographic experience on three continents. His current emphasis is on independent multi-image production. (3 projectors, Composer 301, 1½ minutes)

#### **Sacred and Profane**

Martha Edwards is a freelance A-V producer and associate at Mind's Eye Productions. "Sacred and Profane" reflects Martha's interest in documenting American art and culture. This show explores the artistic and spiritual connections between two contrasting art forms. (3 projectors, Composer 301, 5½ minutes)

#### **Vier Stufen**

This experimental work explores the human condition in transition within the confined boundaries of today's world. Translated from German, the title means "Four Steps." (3 projectors, Composer 301, 5½ minutes)

#### This Bud's For You

An attempt is made to provide a legal perception of an illegal activity. Pete's contribution to this joint project was the design and photography. Wayne, the musician, scored it. (3 projectors, Composer 301,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  minutes)

After viewing "Thief," photographers should perhaps look at the portraits on their light tables and wonder if they have taken MORE than a picture.
