## Berkeley Elliott

August 23, 1917 - January 3, 1995

After 77 years of loving service to family and friends, Berkeley Elliott began her eternal ascent to Paradise. She was raised in Ripley, Oklahoma in a family of eight brothers and sisters. She is survived by her sister, Vacie King of Ponca City, Oklahoma and her niece, Kathleen King of Tulsa.

Berkeley's impact on the Urantia movement was phenomenal. She was a charter member of the First Urantia Society of Oklahoma, which was formed November 1957. Berkeley continuously hosted weekly study groups, at least one and sometimes as many as three, at her home since 1957.

Her service to the Urantia fellowship included several terms as a member of the General Council, member of the Domestic Extension Committee and chairman of the International Fellowship Committee.

One of her favorite methods of serving the Urantia movement was organizing conferences. She displayed a special skill at finding individuals with expertise on spiritual matters who were also excellent communicators. These talents were best displayed in the success of the Scientific Symposia and the many Forums hosted in Oklahoma.

Her dedicated efforts to bring harmony and wisdom to the Urantia movement are legendary and will be missed worldwide. Words can not adequately portray the life she lived and the love she bestowed on all who knew her. Many souls in times of great need were strengthened by Berkeley's wise counsel and they have lived richer lives due to her spiritual and practical guidance.

The Mansions on High have gained a tireless servant who will no doubt continue her ministry of devotion and love forever. We all look forward to greeting her again when we too continue on our journey to the portals of Paradise.
