she thought I was in the wrong. As far as I can see, the only way I can reach all the members she told and clear myself is by going before the meeting."

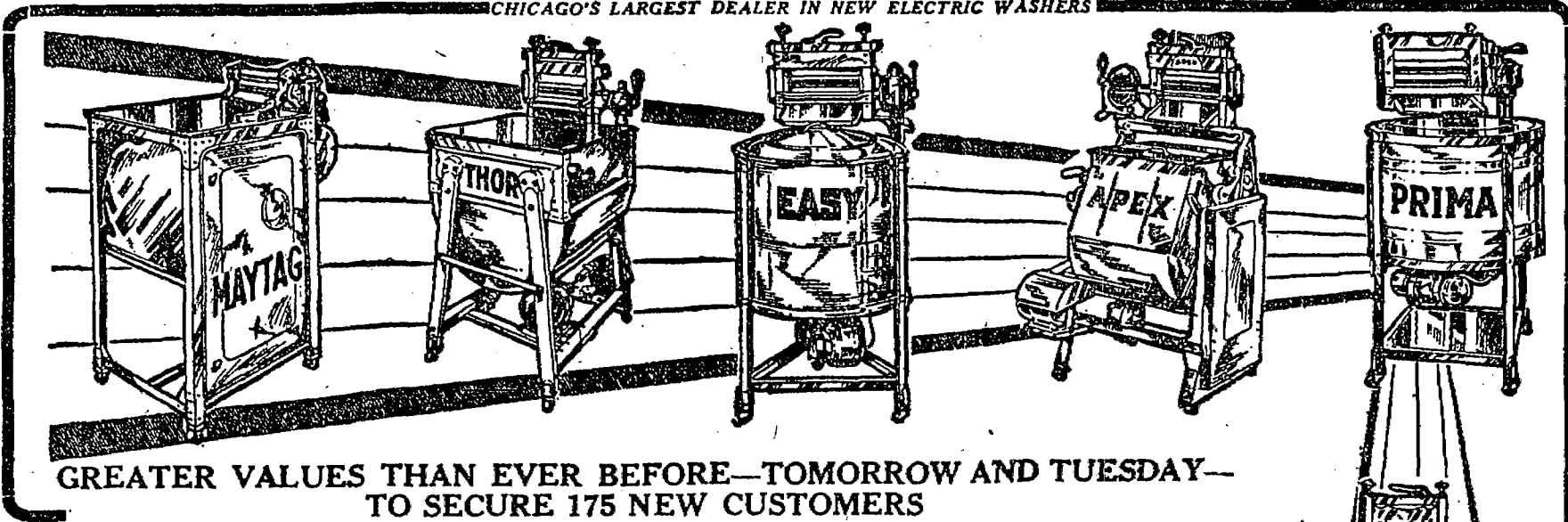

Omelet Sauce, Celery Curis, Stuffed Potatoes, Russian Cream, Washed Potatoes, Banana Icebox Cake, Spanish Omelet, Stuffed Olives, Creamed Carrots, Lady Fingers, Lettuce Salad, French Dressing, Coffee, Shrimp Cocktail, Radish Rosas, Lamb Kidney Souffle, Peas with Mint, Stuffed Pear Salad, Coffee.

Omelet Sauce: Brown 1 minced onion and 1/2 lb. sliced mushrooms in bacon fat. To this add 1 can condensed tomato soup and 1/2 cup peas. Heat well. Celery Curis: Cut stalks of celery in 2-inch lengths. Fringe each piece almost to the bottom. Put in ice water to curl. Split stalk in quarters, crisp in ice water. Radish Rosas: Peel cleaned radish in 1/2-inch strips from top to bottom, leave bottom end attached to the radish. Drop in ice water. Cocktail Sauce: 1/2 cup tomato catsup, 1/4 cup lemon juice, 1/4 cup grated horseradish, 2 teaspoons Tabasco sauce, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/4 cup vinegar. Mix well and chill.

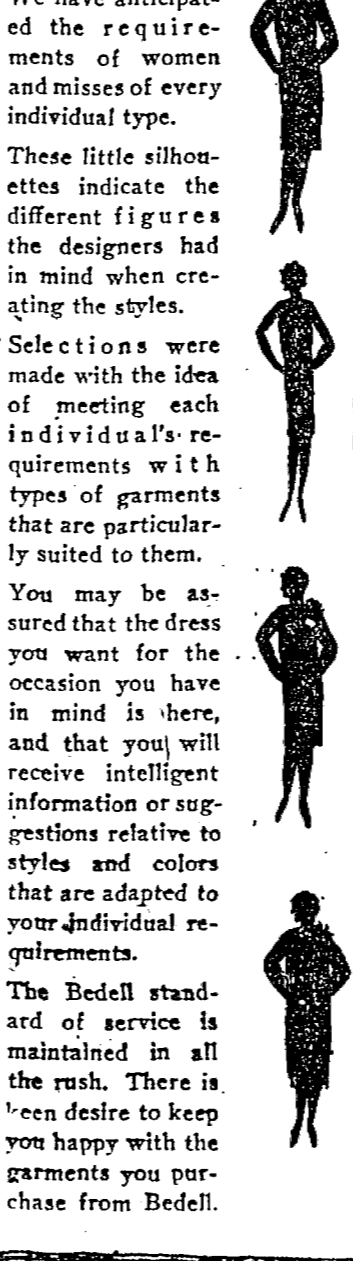
