OPEN INQUEST TODAY IN DEATH OF SADLER KIN

An inquest will be opened today into the death Monday of William S. Sadler III, 19, grandson and namesake of a prominent Chicago psychiatrist. Young Sadler died in Columbus Memorial hospital 24 hours after he fell into a coma in his home at 533 Diversey pkwy. The inquest will be held at 2701 N. Clark st.

An autopsy failed to reveal the cause of death, and a chemical analysis has been ordered by Coroner Walter McCarron. Sadler was a third year psychology student at the University of Chicago.

Suffered Fainting Spell

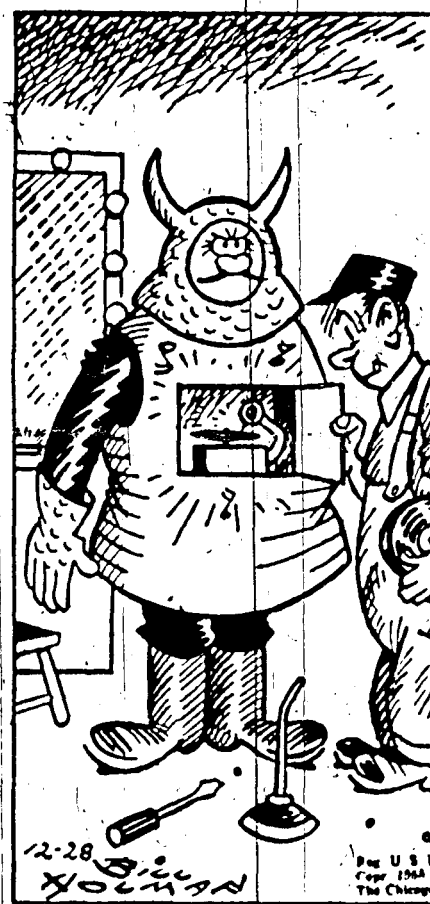
Dr. Sadler related that his grandson suffered a fainting spell while drinking coffee about 4:20 p. m. on Christmas day. He said he worked over him for four hours before ordering his removal to the hospital.

Dr. Sadler, who has practiced in Chicago since 1906, is director and chief psychiatrist for the Chicago Institute of Research and Diagnosis. His wife, Dr. Lena Sadler, was associate director of the institute when she died in 1939.

Services on Friday

Young Sadler was the son of the junior William S. Sadlers. His father heads a firm of business management consultants with offices at 333 N. Michigan av. He also leaves a brother, Charles, 18, and a sister, Patricia, 16.

Memorial services will be held at 8 p. m. Friday in the chapel at 2701 N. Clark st.

SADLER INQUEST CONTINUED FOR POLICE INQUIRY

2 Relatives Testify at First Hearing

An inquest into the death Monday of William S. Sadler III, 19, grandson of a prominent Chicago psychiatrist, was continued yesterday until Feb. 14 to permit the completion of chemical analysis and further police investigation.

The young man's father, William S. Sadler Jr., of 533 Diversey pkwy., a management consultant, testified that his son, a third year psychology student at the University of Chicago, lost the sight of his left eye late in 1953 and that the sight of

his right eye had been partially impaired at intervals since then.

Fail to Find Cause

He said medical examinations failed to reveal the cause but that his son's condition had improved and he had not been melancholy over his plight. Young Sadler collapsed on

Christmas night in his home apparently while trying to answer a telephone call. Dr. William Sadler, director of the Chicago Institute of Research and Diagnosis testified that he later had his grandson taken to Columbus hospital.

The first diagnosis at the hospital indicated Sadler was suffering from a brain tumor. Later tests revealed high sugar content in his system indicative of diabetes. He died 23 hours later without regaining consciousness.

Fiancee Mentioned

The doctor said his grandson was somewhat perturbed because his fiancee, Sharon Russakov, 17, of 700 Bittersweet pl., attended the University of Illinois at Champaign last fall rather than go to a college here.

Miss Russakov told a Tribune reporter that Sadler was in excellent spirits when he escorted her home from a family party on Christmas eve.

Chief Deputy Coroner Norman R. Gibbons asked her to attend the next hearing. When questioned by Gibbons, Dr. Sadler testified that his grandson's coma did not resemble one which would be induced by barbiturates.

Miss Sharon Russakov, 17, of

 a friend and had been intro-
 duced to young Sadler by the
 latter's sister at a school party.
