Most of our mail comes from high school, college, and university students, and their questions largely concern how to find God, how to tap the will, wisdom, and power of God, and how to live a dynamic philosophic-spiritual life. All letters are personally answered by our trained staff of young co-workers," Grimsley said.

"This is an age of seekers, and we at the Spiritual Renaissance Institute say there is something to find--God. When you seek God, you seek it all; when you find God, you find it all."
