


FRANCYL BEGINS WORK ON STUDIO ALBUM

Following in the wake of tremendous response to her first album, a collection of recordings from various conference and concert performances, Francyl has begun work on a new studio-produced album. Utilizing multi-track recording techniques and more extensive instrumentation than in her live performances, Francyl is producing a collection of material which far surpasses anything she has ever done, both in quality of execution and inspirational quantity of content. Two new programs are now in production. "Genesis", our first program, has received so many requests for showings that we are producing an improved version with much better visuals. Included will be some animated sequences expressing the process of photosynthesis, the workings of the DNA molecule, and activity within the mammalian nervous system. The second program traces the evolution of the God concept on our planet, culminating in the concept of God as a loving Father. This program is being produced for general audiences, and we are planning promotion and distribution on video tape as well as in the slide format. These programs are scheduled for completion in early 1981.

Dealing with the essence of religious experience, the presentation looks behind the cultural forms of religion and probes the motivations and satisfactions which lead people into spiritual living. In addition to the narration by Family of God Foundation staff, the program contains interviews with a Sikh leader, a Yoga instructor, a Christian editor, and an Islamic Imam. The program comes ready to use and consists of a carousel of slides and a cassette. Tones on the cassette indicate when to advance the slides. The production and presentation of multi-media programs is a very complex process. During the course of our development, we have stumbled upon several axioms which appear to be related to some of the early work done by Murphy ("If anything can possibly go wrong, it will"). While we would not venture so far as to suggest that these are evidences of problems resulting from the incomplete functioning of providence, we present these findings for your consideration:

COROLLARY 1: "The length of any available extension cord is inversely proportional to the distance between the objects to be connected".

COROLLARY 2: "The number of problems discovered in any performance setup is directly proportional to the proximity of starting time".

COROLLARY 3: "The probability of equipment failure during a performance is directly proportional to the size of the audience".

COROLLARY 4: "The most convenient completion date for any A/V production will always be at least two weeks after the first scheduled performance".

COROLLARY 5: "The probability of forgetting a critical piece of equipment is directly proportional to the distance traveled to the performance".

Then there is KEELER'S OBSERVATION which states, "The correct operating parameters of any project can be calculated according to the following formula: Take the number of people who said they would help, and divide by 2. Then take the total projected cost of the project and multiply by 2".

If you are contemplating travel in conjunction with your work, you might give serious consideration to VERN'S TRAVEL AXIOMS, which state, "The shortest distance between two speaking engagements is under construction". The second axiom states, "The proximity of any two speaking engagements will be inversely proportional to the availability of air transportation".
