Six years ago Hoite Caston issued a document he called Vern Grimsley Message Evaluation in which he opposed Vern and the Family of God Foundation.


We choose then not to engage in a public "paper war" based partially on our belief that the Urantia movement should not be divided and reasoning that action on our part could intensify the controversy and jeopardize the Urantia movement. Now that the Chicago headquarters organizations are in fact divided, that rationale no longer exists.

Six years ago there was no forum or opportunity -- aside from a "paper war" -- to present information in response to Hoite's accusations to a body of individuals attempting to evaluate evidence on both sides.

Hoite's document is very extensive and taking it on, point by point, is not my present intention. What I do wish to do is twofold:

To go on record stating that it is my firm opinion that Hoite's Report presents a distorted, exaggerated, and very, very unfair picture of Vern and FOG.

To offer a few documents, selected specifically because they are from third party sources, as examples of information Hoite either missed or disregarded.

Now he claims to be receiving "messages" from the supermortal planetary government for the guidance of the URANTIA Movement and asks us to take his word for it.

Looking forward to being with you in San Francisco.

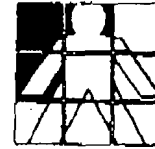

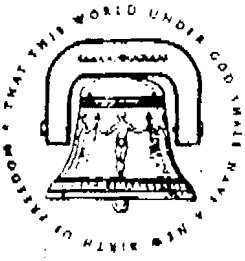

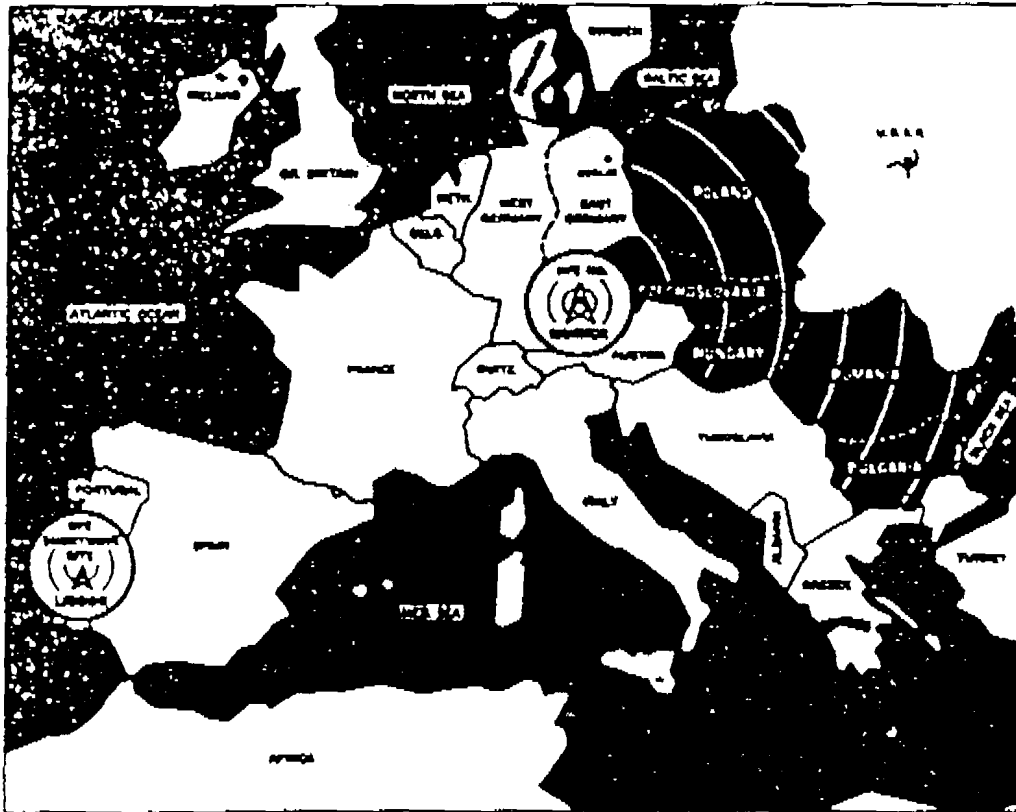

KGB defector tells of Kremlin's panic

LONDON (UPI) — Kremlin paranoia over Western military manoeuvres in 1983 brought Moscow close to pushing the "panic button" that might have unleashed the Third World War, claims a KGB defector.

The revelations of Oleg Gordievski, the most senior KGB officer ever recruited by the West, were published in *The Sunday Telegraph*.

"When Gordievski was finally plucked from Moscow, he had given Britain and her allies a priceless flow of information as well as a chilling example of how paranoia in the Kremlin almost brought the world to war in the autumn of 1983," said Gordon Brook-Shepherd, described as

the first Western writer to interview the ex-spy — a former KGB station chief in London.

The Kremlin became "jittery" in November, 1983, when the North Atlantic Treaty Organization launched a secret command-post drill to practise nuclear release procedures in the event of all-out war. Code-named "Able Archer," it was scheduled to run Nov. 2-11.

"As a matter of routine, Warsaw Pact intelligence began to monitor the exercise. In equally routine fashion, Western intelligence began to monitor the monitors," it said.

But the West, in the post-Leonid Brezhnev period of ailing Yuri Andropov's leadership when the Soviet military

might have been calling most of the shots, detected a sharp increase in the urgency and tone of the communist communications.

"The incredible seemed to be happening, namely that the Warsaw Pact suspected it might really be facing nuclear attack at any moment," the newspaper said.

The paper said Gordievski, who turns 50 this month, told the British who recruited him in 1974 that they should realize they were reaching a "danger zone."

The newspaper did not quote the ex-spy directly on the revelations, but said the full story would be told later this month in a new book by Brook-Shepherd, *The Storm Birds*.

I purchased The Storm Birds when it became available in August 1989. It bears out the information in this review.
