A letter from SMV's President Royce Russell

"Truth is always a revelation (p.1109)" and "it is the comprehension of truth that constitutes the highest form of human liberty." (p.2060) The School of Meanings and Values caters to the discovery and expression of that spiritual forward urge through its many offerings that are centered upon the truth (revelation) of The URANTIA Book. And through these venues our minds are freed to comprehend those truths and indulge ourselves in that liberty.

Guilt, Part II

The URANTIA Book makes a distinction between two kinds of guilt origin. The first has to do with mores and morals.

"The sense of feeling of guilt is the consciousness of the violation of the mores: it is not necessarily sin...the possibility of the recognition of the sense of guilt is a badge of transcendent distinction of mankind. It does not mark man as mean but rather sets him apart as a creature of potential greatness and ever-ascending glory distinction." (p.984)

The feeling of guilt is an early experience learned from disobedience in our early training and conditioning by parents, family, teachers and other adult authority. All of us remember our very young feelings of guilt resulting from the cover-up. It could have been stealing a cookie, breaking a dish, running away from chores, or even an accident. And even after the indwelling of the Thought Adjuster, these responses became a part of growing up in most cases validated as healthy by adult disciplinarians. Often these high standards or ideals are confused with religion and religious growth. The Urantia teachings explain that man's moral ideals are not the same as God's expectations or will.

In this case, "The sense of guilt (not the consciousness of sin) comes from either interrupted spiritual communion or from the lowering of one's moral ideals. Deliverance from such a predicament can only come through the realization that one's highest moral ideals are not necessarily synonymous with the will of God. Man cannot hope to live up to his highest ideals, but he can be true to his purpose of finding God and becoming more and more like him.

Jesus swept away all of the ceremonials of sacrifice and atonement. He destroyed the basis of all this fictitious guilt and sense of isolation in the universe by declaring that man is a child of God: the creature-Creator relationship was placed on a child-parent basis. God becomes a loving Father to his mortal sons and daughters. All ceremonials not a legitimate part of such an intimate family relationship are forever abrogated.

"God the Father deals with man his child on the basis, not of actual virtue or worthiness, but in recognition of the child's motivation — the creature purpose and intent. The relationship is one of parent-child association and is actuated by divine love." (p.1133)

There is no place for "fictitious guilt" and in the knowledge that we are forgiven (for meaning before we ask) by God, we need also to forgive ourselves and accept the fact of being an evolutionary creature that is becoming perfect very very gradually.

Another kind of guilt comes from the awareness of deliberate sin. "Guilt is purely a matter of personal sin and knowing, deliberate rebellion against the will of the Father and the administrations of his Sons." (p.2003)

It is interesting the phrase does not say the feeling of guilt, but guilt, which in this case seems legitimate and a natural consequency of rebellion against the will of the Father. This guilt seems justified for it is a warning signal that makes us feel isolated and alienated from God.

"Sin must be redefined as deliberate disloyalty to Deity. There are degrees of disloyalty: the partial loyalty of indecision, the divided loyalty of confliction: the dying loyalty of indifference; and the death of loyalty exhibited in devotion to godless ideals.."

"The foregiveness of sin by Deity is the renewal of loyalty relations following a period of the human consciousness of the lapse of such relations as the consequence of conscious rebellion. The foregiveness does not have to be relations between creature and the Creator. And all the loyal sons of God are happy, service-loving and ever-progressive in the Paradise ascent." (p.985)

In receiving foregiveness we take it up and own it, knowing that if God can forgive even deliberate rebellion, surely we can forgive also and pick up the pieces. With forgiveness the creature finds that guilt vanishes. The renewal of loyalty brings fresh purpose, new energy, and a sense of warmth, peace and containment in the arms of our merciful, understanding Father.

As imperfect creatures doubtless old patterns will crop up now and then. Realizing that guilt has no place in our lives is the first step to renewing a faith unencumbered with old baggage. SMV

SMV Takes a Journey to the East: THE ACCESSIBILITY OF GOD: EXPLORING THE GIFTS OF THE FATHER, SON AND SPIRIT

Polly Friedman was urged to bring a program from
The School of Meanings and Values to Connecticut,
last year. With the help of K. Brendi Poppel and
Stephen Zendt, a full day of study and lecture was
created on the theme of THE ACCESSIBILITY OF God,
on the campus of Briarwood College in Southington,
Connecticut.

People from all over the area, from Manhattan and even from Rhode Island, arrived for this program. Our hosts for the weekend were from Newport, Rhode Island and provided transporation to and from Briarwood College, half way across the state of Connecticut.

Our day was divided into three portions: 1) Fact 2) Meaning and 3) Value. Brendi, a musician and poet, opened the program by sharing some of her words with us. She then introduced "Poprah Windex" an outrageous send-up of certain television personalities, played by our own Polly Friedman! She proceeded to grill a professional "Dr. Zenda" about certain claims made in the pages of a certain large book. Amid the laughter, some real learning took place, as we worked with the differential between the Eternal Son and Michael, our Creator Son, one of many such Sons throughout the Grand Universe.

After removing his Dr. Zenda character, Stephen Zendt spoke about the Gift of the Son — the Spirit of Truth as it manifests itself to us.

A break for lunch allowed for a great deal of fellowship and enjoyment of the pot-luck meal contributed by many of the attendees. Old friends and new mingled warmly for about an hour before the afternoon session began, led by Polly on the Gifts of the Infinite Spirit, including our own Mother Spirit of Nebadon, Mind Spirits, Holy Spirit and Angels.

Then it was Brendi's turn, centering on The Gift of the Father — The Thought Adjuster, and regaling us with new insights through her poetry and music. She focused on the need to follow healthful practices for the body and mind in order to allow the Adjuster maximum advantage in renewal of our minds.

The final portion of the program was sharing in small groups of six or seven, focusing on the questions: 1) In what ways have you as an individual accessed God's gifts? 2) How have you overcome barriers that allow God to access you? These two provocative questions stimulated some active discussion in each of the several groups huddled around the large open classroom. A reporter from each of the groups helped everyone to get a glimpse

of those insights gained in the individual group of which he or she was a participant.

Polly closed the program with a brief but very touching worship in which all of us joined in a big circle with a variety of cut flowers, one per person, to be placed into a central vessel, symbolizing the combination of each personal self into a arrangement of beauty and wide variety. It seemed the perfect climax to a lengthy presentation with many levels of meaning and personal perception.

We were very grateful to the Connecticut Fellowship for the invitation and the arrangements, and to Peter Miller of Newport, Rhode Island who handled transporation and sleeping accommodations for Polly and for Stephen. It was fascinating to see this richly historic area on the Atlantic Coast and to spend a day in the company of such accomplished and enthusiastic students of our revelation.

Our "Journey to the East" was well worth the time and effort, and we anticipate development of other programs of this type for future invitations to travel. It is this sort of experience that lends deeper significance to Jesus' exhortation: "those to whom much has been given, much will be required..."

Teilhard de Chardin was a realist and mystic — a scientist, paleontologist, philosopher and Jesuit priest. In his life and work he combined his knowledge of science and evolution with insights of spiritual truth that yield a profound perception ahead of its time, and that also parallel the teachings of the Fifth Epochal Revelation. INTEGRATING MEANINGS AND VALUES IN THE COMMUNITY

Sighs of the Times

I am concerned with the connection between revelation and evolution, with making it useful on this earth. "Thus must and does revelation always keep in touch with evolution." (p.1007) For me, this means contact with Christians. My current setting is a liberal Christian seminary, and I have a few observations to make.

The URANTIA Book utilized liberal Protestant writers like Hocking and Baillie when it drew from human sources. But these writers have been largely forgotten by Protestantism. Worse than this, their ideas are sometimes scorned by supposed liberals: for instance, the idea that there were religious geniuses who fostered theological progress.

In fact, the whole idea of progress is almost lost. To assert that any religious development is more advanced than any other is now branded "cultural imperialism." Terms like "advanced," "primitive," "higher" (so common the in The URANTIA Book) are virtually forbidden words.

All the trends are just the opposite of what we find in The URANTIA Book. While everybody nowadays is combining the disciplines and blurring the boundaries, The URANTIA Book says "Science deals with facts; religion is concerned only with values" (p.1110:5). Many Christians are saying that churches must be involved in political action, but The URANTIA Book spends a whole paper (Paper 99) refuting this. While most people try to minimize the differences between the races, and turn "equality" into a religious ideal, The URANTIA Book unembarrassedly describes "inferior" and "superior" races and speaks of the necessity of eugenics. The URANTIA Book is as un-PC (politically correct) as it could be.

The corrosion of belief in the Bible which has been going on for 200 years, has reached its peak (or nadir). Mainstream Protestants have less faith in the Bible than ever before — and yet, this may be a cleansing phenomenon. There is no cheap, second-hand Christology in mainstream Protestantism any more. Protestants who have faith in Jesus, have had to exert spiritual and intellectual effort, study history, and recognize that there is something irreducible about this man. But not everyone is able to fight through the forest of reductionistic and skeptical interpretations.

Protestantism is weak now, as regards belief in the person and mission of Jesus — though it affirms his "egalitarian" values. Many believers are voting with their feet, moving to a Bible church, or up the street to the Roman cathedral, or across town to the Orthodox church. Possibly the fastest-growing mainstream church in America is the Antiochene branch of the Eastern Orthodox Church.

What do the "gaining" churches have in common? They all have a strong Christology. But there is often a lack of honest engagement with the scientific viewpoint, and a willingness to accept second-hand religion. With Protestants, I can mention Christology and evolution in the same sentence, and I can speak to people who use their minds.

Despite these problems — or because of them —
I feel that it is worthwhile for The URANTIA Book
readers to make contacts with Protestants, if they feel
so inclined. We can affirm their truth, and they can
enliven ours.

It is important that we try to be effective. My realistic warnings above are designed to eliminate any cheery delusions about "turning on" the church. Besides, maybe they're already turned-on.

Ethics: Youth and the Community.

When we founded the School of Meanings and Values, in July, 1985, we recognized the importance of broadening our focus to cover several areas. We decided on ones that: promote intellectual growth, foster spiritual insight, and develop teacher and leadership training. We also wanted to be sure to include the integration of meanings and values into the practical mainstream, as well, as a goal. We believe that, as God-seeking and knowing individuals, we are directed to seek and find avenues of service that support and encourage this principle.

In addition to my duties as a director of the School of Meanings and Values, I am also the president of the Santa Monica High School (Samohi) Alumni Association (SAA). There is only one high school in Santa Monica, and nearly all the children of the community pass through it. The SAA is a modest organization, but one that is very closely tied to the communities of Santa Monica and Malibu. Samohi is an old high school, having celebrated its centennial in 1991, and one that both my parents and grandparents attended. It has graduated about fifty thousand young adults in it's one-hundred-plus year history, and has a sizable following, with members living around the world holding a myriad of occupations. About a quarter of the current faculty graduated from it.

Last year, in my role as president, I had the opportunity to create the Superintendent's Banquet. A black-tie, \$100/plate fundraising event. More than fundraiser, we wanted to institute a publicly attended formal event that would bring together all facets of the community. To this end, we required table sponsors to donate two of the ten seats they purchased back to the association so we could invite high school students to join them at their table. Tuxedos were provided for the students at no cost. Local companies such as The Gas Company, GTE, Gillette/Papermate, LA Gear, RAND, DoubleTree Guest Suites, and others shared in hosting the evening.

This year marked our second year. Both years had about 170 in attendance, and raised a nice amount for the high school principal for "unmet school advancement needs." The theme last year was Youth and Values and this year was Ethics: Youth and the Community. The following is the commentary I wrote for the program:

The Board of Directors of the Samohi Alumni Association, in recognition of their unique position in the community, the resources and support of over five thousand alumni, and the deep and abiding affection for Samohi and the students of the Santa Monica-Unified School District created the Superintendent's Banquet in 1994 as a venue where all parts of the community could join together in weaving anew the meanings and values that make the fabric of It is an evening of celebration and daily life. camaraderie between generations of Santa Monica and Malibu residents, business people, elected officials, members of government, students and alumni. It provides a social time for the fair exchange of ideas about values, their meanings and place in our lives; it is a time to share and compare the experiences of living. And it is a time to hear from and speak to those responsible for overseeing the education of all our children, and especially our young adults, the students of Samohi. Proceeds derived from the banquet are placed in the Principal's Fund, an endowment for unmet school advancement needs. We appreciate your support.

In providing this event, we have found a community eager to discuss values. These are wonderful evenings filled with fine food, wonderful speeches, and engaging conversation across generations and socio-economic classes. This year, we invited three CEO's, three faculty, and three students to speak from their tables about what Ethics meant to them. We divided up the speakers between courses, and the evening moved along very nicely. At the end

of the evening, during the dessert course, the Superintendent and the high school principal were given an opportunity to share back with the guests what they heard from the speakers. This was most effective in providing a genuine atmosphere of meaningful dialog with people in positions of leadership, ones who can create and model change.

And of course, the evening ended with the high school jazz band, *The Serenaders*, all twenty-four of them, dressed in their tuxedos, playing big band music from the forties and fifties. It was an exceptional evening, and it centered around the meanings and values of ethics.



A two-day seminar devoted to The Evolution of the Soul, The Thought Adjuster and the Soul, Mind and Soul Evolution, Morontia Experiences Now.

8. EVOLVING COMMUNAL VISION

A one day workshop exploring the meaning of communal vision in preparation for building community. This is a condensed version of the weekend seminar Evolving a Spiritual Community.

9. THE URANTIA LITERACY PROJECT

Workshops designed to develop outlines of the Four Parts of The URANTIA Book for twenty minute, two hours, and full-day presentations.

10. Comparative Study: Teachings of Teilhard de Chardin and The Urantia Book Teilhard de Chardin was a realist and mystic — a scientist, paleontologist, philosopher and Jesuit priest. In his life and work he combined his knowledge of science and evolution with insights of spiritual truth that yield a profound perception ahead of its time, that also parallel the teachings of the 5th Epochal Revelation.

The one-day seminar is primarily devoted to the study of Teilhard's masterwork — *The Phenomenon of Man*, augmented with unusual audio-visual material and small group discussion built around comparative study.

11. THE ETERNAL SON: OUR PATH TO UNDERSTANDING THE NATURE OF GOD

A half-day seminar exploring aspects of the Second Person of Deity and the Relationship of Deity; The Eternal Sons' relationship to man; The Eternal Sons' presence on Earth - through the Life and Teachings of Jesus; recognizing the key tones of the broadcast of the message of the Eternal Son to earth through the daily life of Michael of Nebadon.

12. ACCESSIBILITY OF GOD

A full-day seminar presenting The Gift of the Son: The Spirit of Truth; The Gifts of the Infinite Spirit: Mother Spirit, Mind Spirits, Holy Spirt, Angels; The Gift of the Father: The Thought Adjuster. Culminates with small group sharing.
