- April 21, 23: "Conceptions of God," I & II; by Jim Mills.

Errol & Rochelle Strider comprise the well-known actor and actress team of Creative Spirit.

Seminars will be approximately 3 hours long, and will begin at 1:30 on Wednesdays and Fridays at The Boulder School. The School is located 1/2 block south of Canyon Blvd. (Rt. 119) on 18th Street. Reservations are appreciated, but not required.
