Dear Friend:

This is truly one of the most exciting and challenging times in the history of our planet. We are witnessing the beginning of a new age on Urantia, an age inaugurated by the gift of The URANTIA Book to the peoples of the earth.

We each have the opportunity to contribute to the achievements of this new age; it falls to each of us to decide how we can best serve. The Boulder School is one such opportunity for service and personal discovery.

On September 19, 1983 the third class of students to enter The Boulder School will begin the full-time program which is described in the enclosed Bulletin. We would like to extend to you our invitation to join us on that occasion as a member of that class, to begin a new adventure of study, service, sharing and self-realization. If the first two classes are any indication, this new class will be a diverse and exciting group. Students now at the School range in age from 19 to 63, come from backgrounds as diverse as the Catholic clergy, the construction industry and secondary education. Some are single, some have moved their whole families to Boulder, and they hail from all parts of the United States.

If you believe that our programs are consonant with your personal goals, please send us the enclosed Application for Admission so that we can reserve a place for you in the new class. Space is limited, and applications will be considered in order of receipt.

Even if you are unable to attend the School at this time, there is a way for you to join us in our work: by making a gift to the School to enable us to continue to provide our current services and to improve and expand them.

At this early stage in The Boulder School's career, the support for our programs comes exclusively from annual contributions from a few devoted individuals within the URANTIA movement. Please take the time to read over the enclosed brochure, determine the level of support which you feel that our programs deserve, and make a pledge to contribute that amount to the School.

In order to provide a quality program for the students and a maximum level of service to the wider URANTIA movement through such services as our lending library and publishing operations, our fundraising goal for this year is \$67,550—over \$30,000 of which has already been pledged in pre-campaign contributions. (Please see attached budget for details.)

A pledge of \$50 or more will allow us to dedicate a book in our library in your name, but no gift is too small to have a significant impact on our success. (However, due to our current status as a public non-profit entity, it is possible to make a gift which is too large. Please limit the size of your donation to less than \$5,000.) We can only realize our goals with your help.



If you have any questions or comments regarding our programs or our fundraising campaign, please let us know.


