Academic Advisory Board

Organization, Selection and Responsibilities

1. Organization

The membership of the Academic Advisory Board (AAB) of the Boulder School shall not be fixed, but may vary at the discretion of the Trustees. The AAB is empowered to select one of its members as Chairperson and to assign duties to that person as appropriate.

The AAB is not required to meet as a group in order to discharge its responsibilities, though the Chairperson may call informal meetings at any time.

2. Selection and Terms

The members of the AAB shall be nominated by the officers of the School and confirmed by the Trustees, ~~except that all members of the Education Committee of the URANTIA Brotherhood shall be ex-officio members of this Board.~~

The length of terms shall be three (3) years from the date of appointment by the Trustees. Members may serve any number of terms.

The Trustees are empowered to remove any individual whose relationship with the School is deemed by them to be prejudicial to the interests of the School.

3. Responsibilities

It shall be the responsibility of the AAB to advise the Trustees of the School regarding the improvement of the content and technique of the various programs and projects of the School, specifically:

1) The AAB will periodically receive information and proposals for their consideration and each member will be expected to promptly advise the School regarding those issues.

2) The members of the AAB are also asked to propose ideas for new programs based on their views of the needs of the URANTIA movement and of Urantia as a whole.

3) Each Board member also has the responsibility of seeking out the views and ideas of the readers in his or her region and of keeping those readers informed about the Boulder School.
