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Proposals for enhancing The Boulder School

In these proposals please recall that students attend classes 33 weeks each year, meeting approximately 100 times for a total of 300 hours (not including seminars). The following proposals neither add to, nor detract from the hours students spend in class.

Proposal one: Library Book Placement by Students.

Intended to familiarize the student with public contact sharing The Urantia Book, and to fulfill a priority objective for the Society and the Brotherhood.

Propose to use 160 hours of student volunteer time to place The Urantia Book in 40 libraries which never had, or no longer have a copy on their shelves.

Proposal two: Mandatory Student Volunteer Time.

Propose that each student have counseling sessions with a faculty or trustee member concerning service targets and spiritual goals.

Propose that volunteer time be mandatory in demonstration of student willingness to face new challenges in personal growth through serving.

Proposal Three: Review of other religious writing

Students spent approximately 35 class hours reviewing The New Testament books of the Bible.

Propose that for the school year 1985-86 other religious writings be reviewed; that trustees field suggestions and develop list of religious writings to be reviewed by students; that students make presentations of these religious writings.
