Join us Sunday evening, August 11, at 6:00 PM for a BBQ and social "get acquainted" evening at the school. The program will begin on Monday, Aug. 12, at 9:00 AM and continue through Sunday, Aug. 18, at 12:00 noon.

The week will start off with a look at some of the faith attitudes necessary for effective personal ministry, our relationship to God, ways of practicing God's presence in our daily lives, and the role of prayer and worship. Next we will focus on ministry skills and techniques, such as active listening exercises, counseling methods, parenting skills, and ways of engaging someone in a spiritual dialogue. On Thursday and Friday we will enjoy a two day retreat in the mountains as a time for rest, relaxation, prayer, worship, and dedication. Throughout the week opportunities for both service and outreach will be explored. If you have a special ministry related topic or workshop you would like to present, please let us know.

REGISTRATION: The registration fee is \$50.00 per adult, which includes cabin rental and four meals during the mountain retreat. Teens and kids under 11 will be charged only the retreat center fees, \$21 and \$10 respectively. Please return your registration form with the proper fee enclosed by June 1.

LODGING: Local readers and students look forward to opening their homes to you for lodging and fellowship. Meals are not included. Home lodging is limited and guests will be accomodated in order of the receipt of their applications. Back-yard tent camping is also available - please write and arrange.

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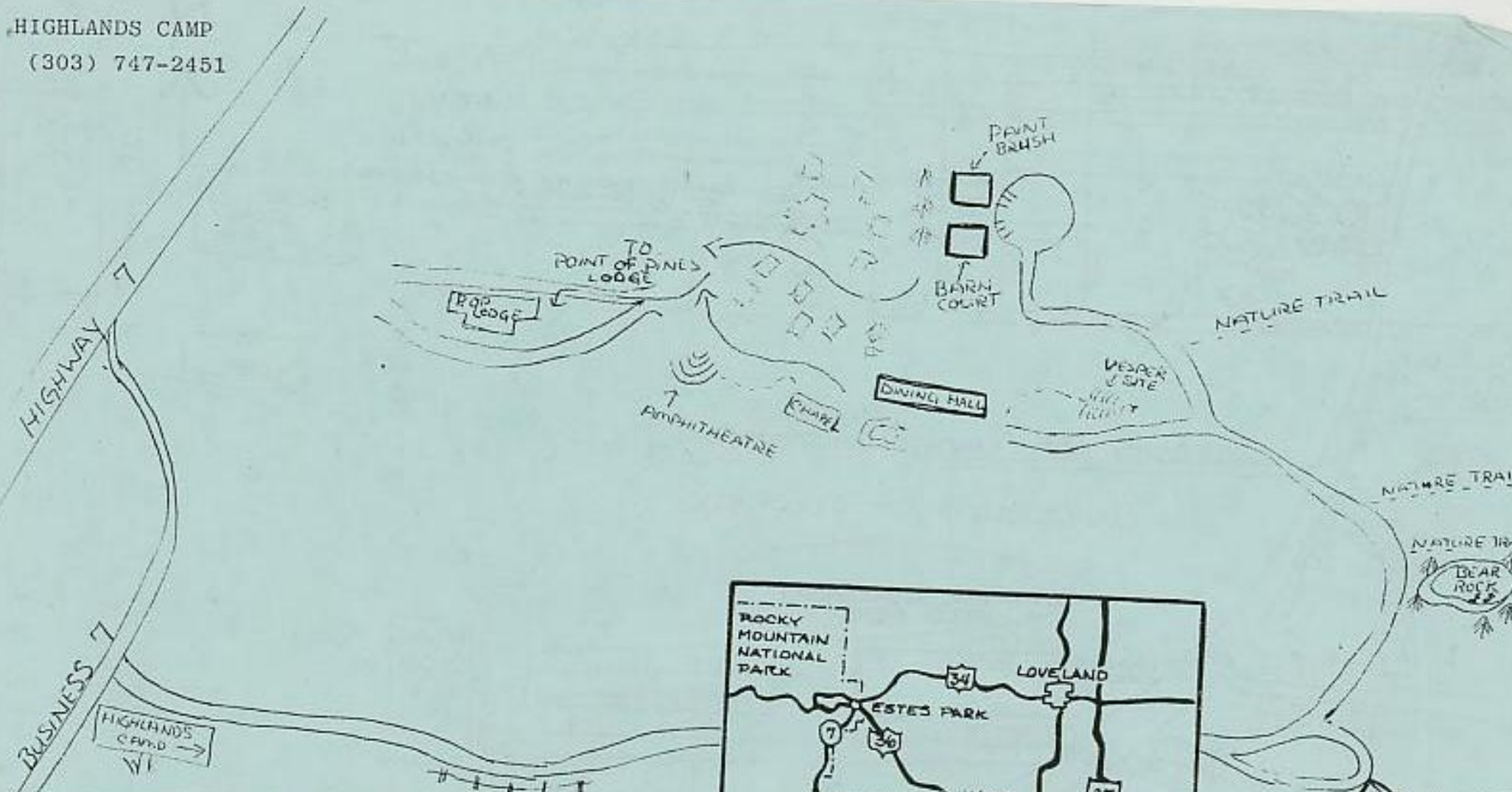

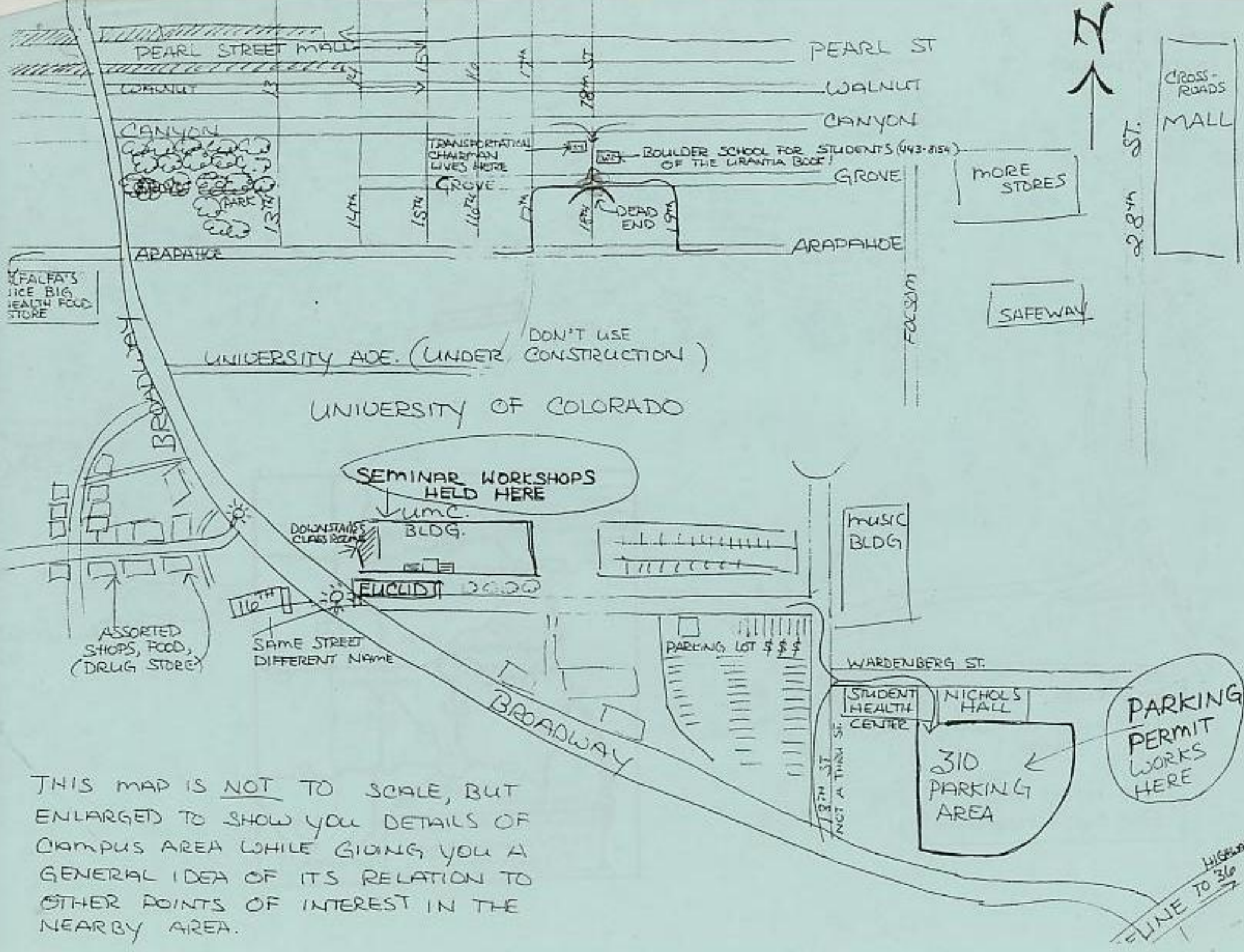
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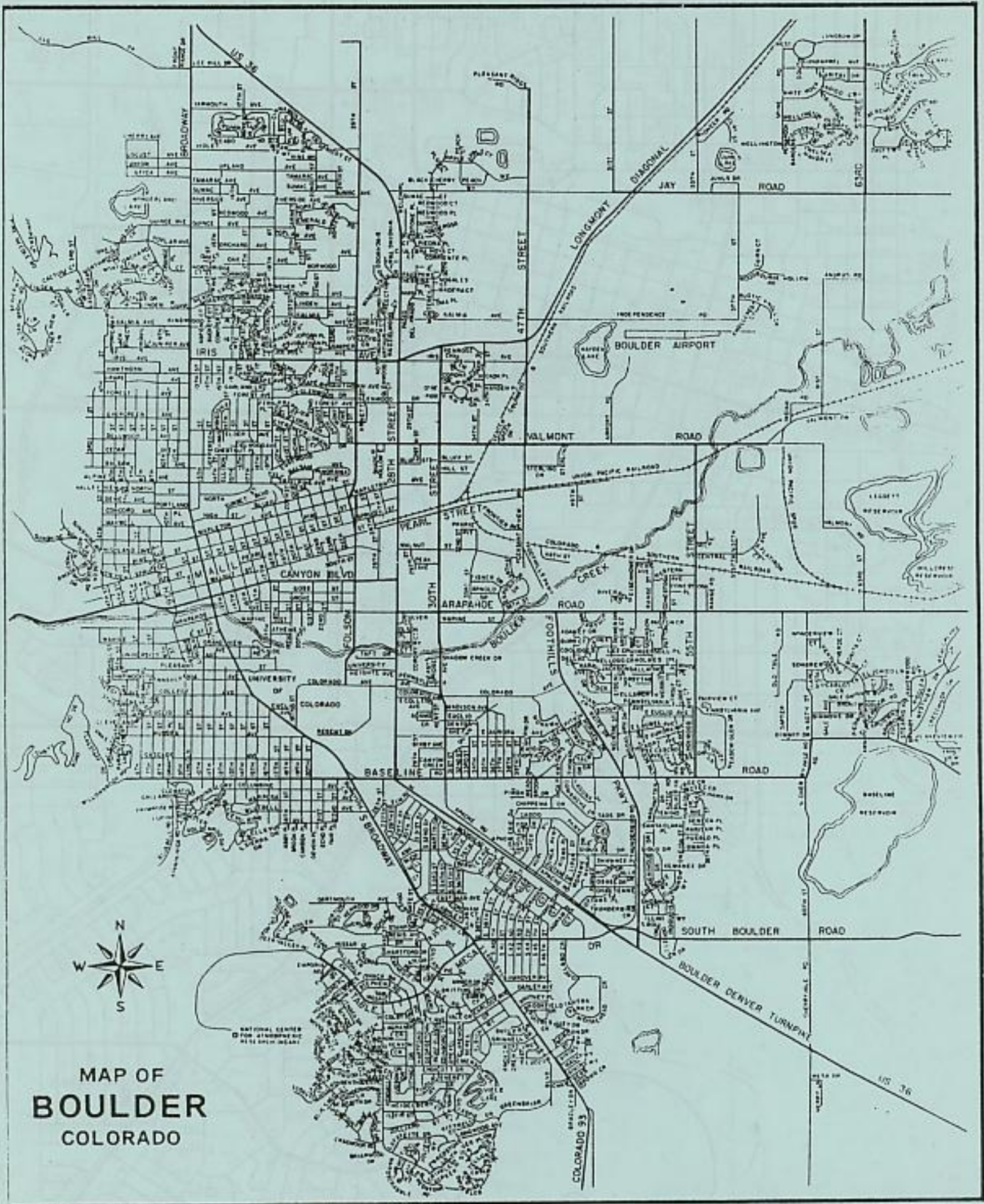

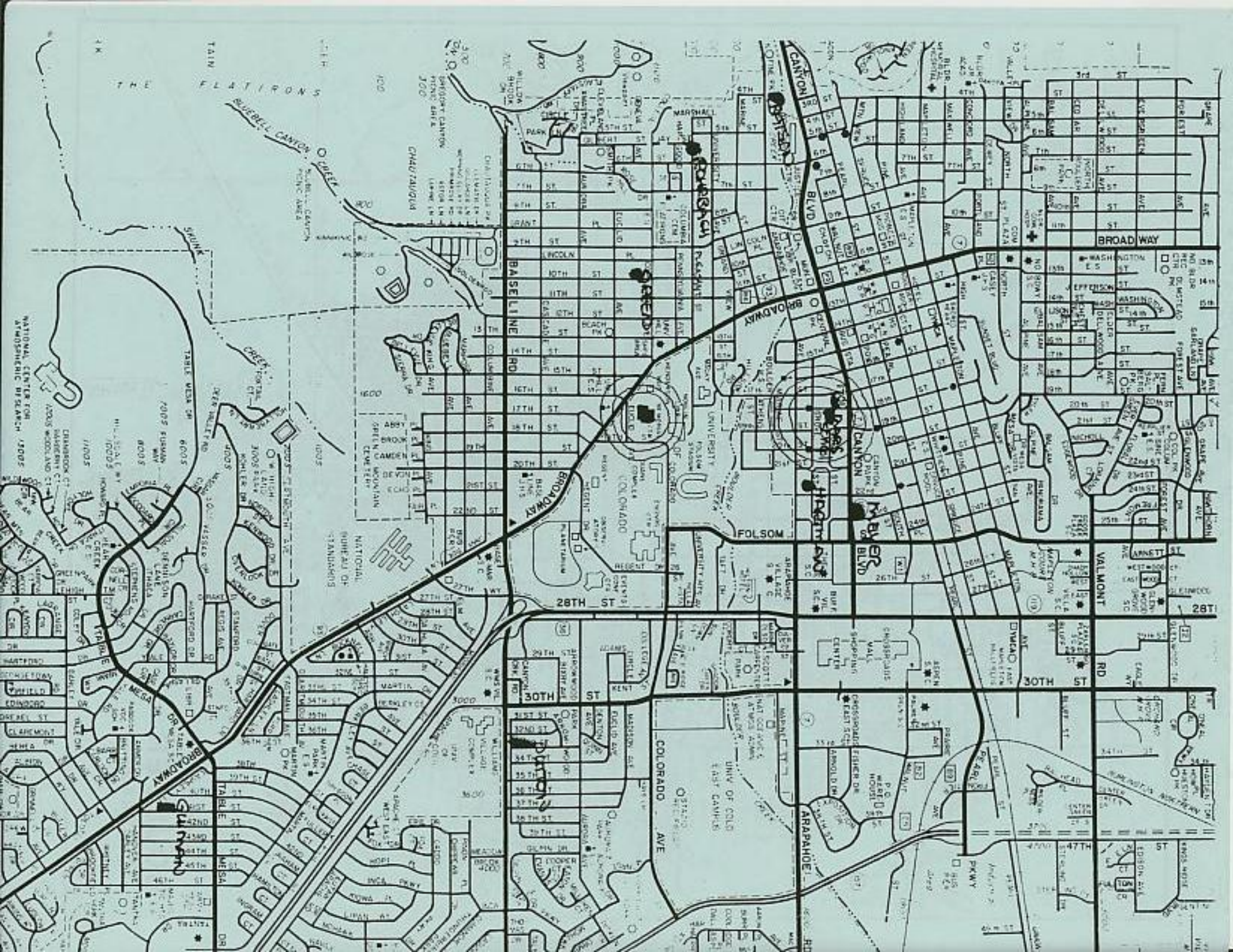
