We will cap off the week with a three day retreat in the mountains as a time for rest, relaxation, prayer, worship and dedication.

REGISTRATION The registration fee is \$100 per adult which includes lodging and meals for the mountain retreat. The lodging at the mountain retreat is a typical camp dorm style lodging (bunk beds) with central baths. If you prefer better and more private accommodations, there are rooms available at an extra charge of \$45 per person. Children and teens will be charged only \$54 for the entire week. Children under 2 are free. Please return your registration form with the proper fee enclosed by **May 15**. If you really cannot afford this registration fee, please let us know, we would like to find some way for you to join us.

LODGING Local readers and students look forward to opening their homes to you for lodging and fellowship. Meals are not included. Home lodging is limited and guests will be accommodated in order of the receipt of application. Some backyard tent camping is also available. After we run out of home lodging, we will have dorm rooms available on the CU campus, where the majority of our program will be held, at an additional cost.

CHILD CARE We will have planned activities for the children throughout the week. If you have children who will be attending, your participation is requested for one morning or afternoon session during the week.

YOU MAY WANT TO BRING Both cool and warm weather clothing, good walking shoes or hiking boots, notebook, musical instruments, camera, swimming gear (swimming will be available both at BBQ and retreat). Linens at retreat will be provided.
