"LIFE PERSPECTIVE SEMINAR" with Gordon Bellamy

Gordon develops a model of the human personality that represents a synthesis of ideas from The URANTIA Book. From this emerges a concept of mature character. Using slides, film clips, ample handouts, and lecturettes, Gordon helps the audience to take stock of their own character growth. The fruits of the spirit take on new meaning in the context of this system of personality encompassing body, mind, spirit, soul, emotion, and character.

Gordon has been a reader of The URANTIA Book since 1969 and active for 12 years in the Victoria study group. Married for 29 years and the father of three, he has worked in sales and marketing in Western Canada for many years. As a volunteer he has worked for the Salvation Army and for United Appeal, and he has been chairman of the Advisory Council of the youth organization, DeMolay. He has also served as a director of the Housing and Urban Development Association, Canada's national governmental body in charge of such matters. He has wide experience in giving technical product seminars and sales information seminars.

"SOCIOLOGY AND RELIGIOUS OUTREACH" by David Fraser

How can the social sciences help us be more effective in religious outreach? Are there techniques that top managers use that are legitimate and beneficial for religionists as well? What are some of the most important choices facing someone who desires to do outreach ministry? Dave's book, co-authored with Edward Dayton, Planning Strategies for World Evangelization (Eerdmans, 1980), is a textbook at the Boulder School this winter. Dave will expand on themes from that book and respond to questions that this book has raised for readers locally. The fields involved in his study include sociology, anthropology, theology, missiology, and management.

Dave has advanced degrees from Harvard University, Fuller Theological Seminary, and a recent Ph.D. in theological ethics from Vanderbilt University. He has taught in university and seminary classrooms and has published many scholarly studies. He has experience as a pastor and is currently Consultant in Church Growth and Evangelism to a Presbyterian Church in New Jersey. Married, the father of two children, Dave is recalled by Jeff Wattles as "the professor from whom I learned most at seminary—and a friend for life."

These seminars will be held from 7 to 9:30 p.m. at The Boulder School. The School is located one-half block south of Canyon Boulevard (Route 119) on 18th Street.
