Dear Jim,

Having written to Philip Eversoul concerning my hope of having a Jesusonian center here, your name came up in connection with your touch with fellow Urantian-Jesusonians who might be interested in investing in a concentrated living effort to raise the consciousness of the planet toward the higher levels of being.

Specifically Jim, I am living on a piece of land on the Island of Kauai in the Hawaiian Islands which is perhaps the most beautiful spot on Earth. Originally developed by a millionaire civil war colonel as his garden estate, the eighty-one acres is an ideal place for inner work. Bounded by two streams which meet at a point on the property on their way to the sea three miles below, these waterways produce spectacular waterfalls.

Every manner of fruit tree grows here including two groves of lichee trees numbering some four-hundred. The lichee as a potential cash crop has been past proven here. There are numerous avacado trees, banana groves, orange trees, papaya, mango, guava and passion fruit, plus a multitude of rare tropical plants - virtually a paradise within paradise!

In 1950 the spacious southern mansion burned and since then the jungle has taken over. Though exquisitly exotic, jungle here must be controlled in order to cultivate the fields necessary for the land to support itself.

What I propose is an agricultural community of Jesusonian scholars whose purpose is the demonstration of self-sufficiency; a school of the art of living much as was Dalamatia where those of other cultures come to study and learn the essentials of material and spiritual life.

And what better site for this than Kauai "the Garden Island", oldest of the Hawaiian chain, home of the legendary Menehune - ancient race of miracle-workers long gone before the Polynesian migrations; Kauai with its central peak Waialeale, wettest spot on the globe - symbol of fertility.

There is an atmosphere of spirituality here Jim. To me there is hope and promise that better things are in store for Urantia men. But it will take deep dedication. It will take great energy. And its going to take money.

Presently the ownership of this land is in my name. I am willing to turn this over to that brotherhood of souls that can share this dedication. However this coming September first 1975, a big down payment is due. Although there are indications that we can negotiate for less, the down payment is two hundred forty thousand.

I believe, Jim, that the Father has put me here for this purpose. There are others here who feel the same energy. But we need help.

As Philip suggests in his important letter concerning the Jesusonian way, our first priority is to establish centers.

I submit that the time is now and the place is here!
