We enjoyed the August issue of *The MONITOR*, particularly the article about Duane and Lucille for whom I have much liking and respect.

Bruce Fiero's article was good—but I want to add some to it.

Yes, peace is what we desire, and is our goal, but Peace at any price is not peace. Neville Chamberlain wanted that, and it probably brought on World War II.

Of course the quotations from 1490–91 are true, but they are talking about an evolutionary process. Page 911 under no. 14—"No great social or economic change should be attempted suddenly. Time is essential to all types of human adjustment."\* (p. 911)

Also, on page 804, section 4 explains why we are not yet ready for a world government, and disarmament might plunge us back into the Dark Ages—undo a thousand years of progress.

In the fifth paragraph of Bruce's article—"and now expect the world's unevolved governments to answer. But what a hopeless task it seems." Yes, it seems hopeless, because we get impatient. And most of the peoples of the world don't yet understand the Fatherhood of God and the brotherhood of man. It will be a long, drawn-out process, I'm afraid. Maybe we will have to have a Magisterial Son to help us before we're able to achieve it.

# FUSLA BUSINESS

## TRIENNIAL RESOLUTIONS PASSED

Six resolutions were unanimously passed for presentation to the General Council by this year's Triennial Delegate Assembly.

1) The most complex of these resolutions dealt with the current marketing and distribution of The URANTIA Book. The suggested changes were based on two intensive studies by the Special Projects Committee and Domestic Extension. The goal would be to incorporate a series of changes in the current policies established by URANTIA Foundation, which would result in making the book available to more book stores in the United States.

2) That all candidates for the General Council must have read The URANTIA Book in its entirety.

3) That the President of URANTIA Brotherhood request URANTIA Foundation to rewrite the 'copy' of the rear dust jacket of The URANTIA Book. (Whereas the rear dust jacket now gives no hint of the inspirational beauty of the papers, and could be used as an opportunity to convey the spiritual message of the Heavenly Father's love for His earthly children.)

4) That job descriptions of officers and paid employees of URANTIA Brotherhood be prepared by the Executive Committee for the General Council.

5) A reaffirmation of URANTIA Brotherhood's support of URANTIA Foundation's ownership and protection of copyright and registered marks.

6) That some form of group prayer and/or time for silent receptivity to seek Our Father's Will be included into the opening of all Triennial Delegate Assemblies, General Council and Executive Committee Meetings.

All six of these resolutions were unanimously passed by the General Council and passed on to the Executive Committee for proper action.

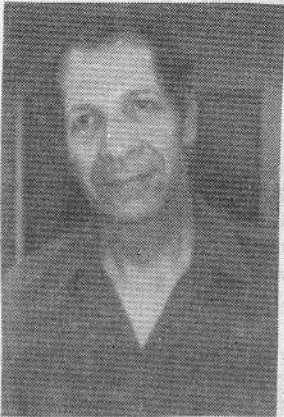

# PORTRAITS

## ROGER ABDO

Roger was born, raised and received his formal education in Chicago, a city that to him is a warm, friendly metropolis that is progressive and service-oriented.

Working as a business executive his activities sequentially moved him from Chicago to Denver, on to Washington D.C. and later to California where he eventually started his own business of some 24 successful years.

As a family man one of Roger's most satisfying achievements has been seeing his son, David, and his daughter, Barbara, grow into mature adults who are a credit to society and a deep joy to him in a very personal way.

From his early childhood Roger had a deep-seated bent for the religion of living. He received a formal religious education in a sect that encouraged him to attend Seminary as a candidate for the priesthood. Roger felt, however, he first wanted to make a

deep study of philosophy and comparative religions.

As the years passed, Roger continued his investigation of one religious avenue after another; always as a participant, not just as an observer. But he never seemed to find that fountain of Truth to quench his thirst for spiritual fulfillment.

Then came that eventful day he loves to tell about in his own inimitable way—his experience in finding *The URANTIA Book*.

Briefly, he was in a book store and happened to pick up the Concordex with all its leading questions on the face of the jacket cover. He said he felt that if any book could answer all those questions he would have found that for which he had been searching all of his life.

Upon examination he found the Concordex was really a study aid to *The URANTIA Book*. So he asked the saleslady in the store if they had a *URANTIA Book*. She told him they were out and would not restock for 3 weeks. Roger said simply, "Well, I can't wait 3 weeks, I want one right now, today!"

Five other bookstores failed to yield the Book. It was only after mentioning his frustration to a friend that he was directed to a North Hollywood bookstore where he found, at long last, the object of his desire.

At this point in the interview, Roger entered upon a most heart-warming narration of his reaction. He said, "I was thrilled at having found the Book; awed at its scope; and the table of contents was simply staggering. To me it was like a powerful light that suddenly flooded my mind showing me where I was and the road I was to follow."

Roger went on to say that in his search for Truth among various religions, the Personality of Jesus always had a strong drawing power for him. And *The URANTIA Book*, he continued, was the most astounding thing he had ever encountered, for not only did he find answers, but as a revelation it showed Jesus in the center of its expanding concept of Truth. He said the whole experience gave him such a sense of discovery that he felt like an archeologist who had been searching all of his life and finally had uncovered the greatest find of his entire career.

Roger has now been a student of *The URANTIA Book* for over five years and has acquired a great depth of understanding for his studies, but has also given equally, in return, of himself.

Many of us have become acquainted with one or more facets of his remarkable nature, knowing him diversely as a successful businessman, a responsible parent, a student, teacher, an actor, and a poet-writer among other things; but we have all come to know him as a warm, generous, outgoing friend who loves his fellow ascenders and is a dedicated worker in the URANTIA movement.

# THOUGHTS

## IN THE SPIRIT OF EVOLUTIONARY RELIGION

Although most of the media coverage is of the growth of fundamentalism, there is a great ferment among more progressive Christians, too. The fundamentalists are still excited by the original transformation by Peter and Paul of Jesus' gospel of the Kingdom of the brotherhood of the sons of God to that of the community of the redeemed believers in the sacrificed Christ. (See p. 1864.) The attraction so many modern Americans find in this idea is illustrated by the devout hope of every born again Christian to be whisked off the planet before the global nightmare of the reign of the Antichrist. For them, following the Master is an escape. But what of the main body of Christian believers?

Not all of the Christians in the established churches of Protestantism, Catholicism, and Orthodoxy have given up hope. Along with the growth of technology that threatens to destroy us there has been a movement to promote the sense of the human family of all nations on Urantia. In the secular world this movement has evolved the League of Nations, the United Nations, and the awakening of many to the threat of annihilation from nuclear war. The Christian community echoes this movement toward world unity in the ecumenism of the Catholic, Protestant, and Orthodox churches. The transformation of ritual and doctrine of all the churches in this century, along with the ecclesiastical emancipation of women, give evidence of the movement of the Spirit of Truth as it leads the church back to the original truth of Jesus' gospel.

Ecumenical dialogue has evolved agenda of agreements rather than disagreements among Christians. The slow death of denominations in Christianity is a sign of great hope for us who believe in the Fifth Epochal Revelation. Our Christian brothers and sisters are awakening to the fact that "a group of mortals can experience spiritual unity, but they can never attain philosophic uniformity."\* (p. 1129) Our way as Readers is made easier by this movement among Christians as it opens the hearts of the sons and daughters of God for living truth.

The time has come to begin to minister to our natal churches. *The URANTIA Book* states that "Only two influences can modify and uplift the dogmas of natural religion: the pressure of the slowly advancing mores and periodic illumination of epochal revelation."\* (p. 1006) Although we firmly believe in the truth of the Fifth Epochal Revelation, we must never fall into the trap of believing we have the whole Truth. Our inspiration is the life of Jesus. Until the very end of his ministry, Christ Michael continued to appeal to the religious establishment of his day, but never at the expense of the gospel of the kingdom.

Bootlegging the teachings of the Book into our contact with Christians, especially those of our natal churches, proclaiming the name of the Book from the housetops when called for, and truly living the Father's will all spread the gospel. Jesus advised his teachers to gear the truth being taught to the intellectual level of the listener and with patience the teacher can see a great harvest. Yet we must not succumb to making *The URANTIA Book* into just another Christian denomination. We can use the avenues of approach afforded by the churches, but we must not confuse the riverbed with the river itself (see p. 1098). By reviving the actual teachings of the Master as revealed in the Book we will hasten the day when "another and greater John the Baptist is due to arise proclaiming 'the kingdom of God is at hand'—meaning a return to the high spiritual concept of Jesus, who proclaimed that the kingdom is the will of his heavenly Father dominant and transcendent in the heart of the believer—and doing all this without in any way referring either to the visible church on earth or to the anticipated second coming of Christ."\* (p. 1866)
