

We still do not know what the "emergency" was in July 1989. Three individuals had resigned from their previous duties as Trustees, but that was a matter of their own personal decisions. There was no crisis of a substantive nature, nothing relating to policy or management issues that the Foundation was addressing. To the contrary, the work of the Foundation was proceeding smoothly. So, once again, we do not understand why all this occurred.

In the long run, the Trustees hope to develop closer relations between the Foundation and readers of The URANTIA Book on regional and local levels. We think this will be a long-range benefit of these tumultuous events. We know that the seraphim and other unseen associates frequently bring about unexpected benefits from circumstances which at first seem difficult. In addition, we believe that the experience of having dealt with this crisis will help the Foundation work out a superior plan for the new URANTIA Brotherhood Association, one that will make it less easily politicized and more likely to concentrate on its spiritual mission.

We believe that the Foundation's policies of minimal organization, proper procedure, and slow growth are entirely necessary. What we are discussing is an extended process that will require many generations, several centuries, or even a millennium. President's Report:

For those who missed the business meeting on March 4th, a brief summary is needed to preface my report. Each member had a chance to speak for two minutes on the question of whether FUSLA should remain in Fifth Epochal Fellowship or join URANTIA Brotherhood Association, a proposed membership organization. At the close of the discussion a motion was overwhelmingly passed to table the matter. Your Governing Committee was assigned the challenging task of seeking more information and of writing a balanced report on the various questions raised at the meeting. Here are some choices and possible pros and cons of each:

THE PART WALKER DEPART FRANCE.

- A. Pass a resolution affirming membership in FEF. While this act of itself does not threaten either <u>The URANTIA Book</u> or URANTIA Foundation, there are members who have indicated that such an act would force them to resign.
- B. Pass a resolution agreeing to join UBA. Because of the stated position of URANTIA Foundation, societies will not be permitted to belong to FEF if this election is made. Again there are members who have stated unwillingness to join an organization with no stated rights, privileges or restrictions and would be forced to resign from FUSLA.
- C. Withdraw from all association with the organizations at the international level, form a non-profit local group and continue the monthly meetings. Individual members could join either FEF or UBA or neither, and the local group would be able to remain neutral. The probable loss of services from both organizations might become a problem in time.
- D. Continue in the same relationship with the Foundation and the Fellowship and urge that their leaders work out their differences at that level, leaving individuals, study groups and societies to continue the personal growth and outreach which is so encouragingly increasing year by year.

Regardless of which course FUSLA takes, it is unlikely that there will be universal agreement, but there can be brotherly love, caring friendship and support for the protection, translation and publication of The URANTIA Book as well as for the membership organization providing the needed services of the Study Group Directory, Area Coordinators, international conferences and outreach assistance and opportunity. Just one last note: for those who want to support the publication of the UB without funding other activities perceived to be destructive, one need only make gifts restricted to the fund(s) for translation and/or publication of The URANTIA Book.

In this Easter Season, let us keep in our hearts and minds the resurrection of the Prince of Peace and his admonitions to love one another.
