THIRD AREA CONFERENCE SET FOR ROCKVILLE

The Third Central Atlantic Conference of URANTIA Book Readers will be held on Saturday, April 28, at the Bauer Drive Recreation Center, 14625 Bauer Drive, Rockville, Maryland -- Phone: (301) 468 4015. The previous conference, held at the same location last October, drew fifty attendees.

Washington, D.C. URANTIA Book reader Daniel Glazer, a computer systems analyst with the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), is the author of an article in the February, 1979, Monthly Labor Review, a Department of Labor publica-tion. The article, "Exploiting the Microdata Foundation of the Current Population Survey," deals with a statistical approach to data usage pioneered for the last ten years by Daniel's office, the Office of Current Employment Analysis. Daniel, an expert on the Current Population Survey microdata, which is the basis, for example, of the unemployment fig-ure published by BLS each month, says of his work, "I find satisfaction in the thought that I'm furthering a socially valuable activity...full employment...enhances the individual and society." Daniel, who is one of the two hosts of the URANTIA Book Study Group of Washington, D.C., says that he has read the URANTIA Book "with wonderment and fascination and gratitude." "The progressive discovery of what it means," he says, "has brought me great joy and confort." Daniel, who was a speaker at the last

This is because Neal, a Foreign Service Officer with the U.S. Department of State, is a diplomat by profession. If you're willing to look behind all the qualifications, conditions, and clarifications in his pronouncements, however, you'll discover some aspirations of great scope and originality.

FUTURE IN CHINA

Currently on assignment to learn the Chinese language in preparation for a year of duty on Taiwan and two more at the U.S. Consulate-General in Hong Kong, Neal plans to embark this summer on a five-year tour of the orient, which could include Shanghai or Canton, depending on developments.

Neal is confident that he will be able to get a study group going in Hong Kong -- a British crown colony, where most people speak English as a second language -- if he is sent there. He is also interested in fostering a world government, which he feels must somehow begin through citizen participation.

Neal is a native of Detroit, Michigan. He attended 'Catholic primary and secondary schools in Detroit, then Yale University, where he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History in June of 1969. His Junior year was in France at the University of Paris, in the Political Science Institute and the Sorbonne,

TURNED FROM THE CHURCH

While a sophomore at Yale, despite the fact that he was serving at the Catholic chapel as Head Lector, arranging the reading schedules for services. Neal became disillusioned and bitter with the church. At this point he suspended his belief, a few years later beginning a search that eventually led him to The URANTIA Book.

Neal was with the U.S. Navy from 1970 to 1975, in Morrocco then in Washington, D.C., and received the Navy Commendation Medal. He held a commission as Lieutenant on

release from the service. Accepting employment with the State Department in January of 1976 and being assigned to the U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, for two successive summers, in 1976 and 1977, he was with the U.S. delegation to the conference of the Committee on Disarmament in Geneva, Switzerland.

Neal enjoys writing plays as a hobby, having acted in plays during high school days and having directed plays in the navy. Should anything professional develop, he would welcome this chance to contact people who might not be reached by more direct means. A bachelor at thirty-two, not yet having married, Neal is quick to admit that he would very much like to put into practice the URANTIA Book recommendations that exalt marriage and child rearing to a high degree.

AREA SERVICE

Neal is a member-at-large of the URANTIA Brotherhood and a key force in developing and serving URANTIA Book readership and related affairs in this area. He has been a regular member of the URANTIA Book Study Group of Columbia, Maryland, since 1974 and is one of the two hosts of the URANTIA Book Study Group of Washington, D.C., which he has attended since its inception in 1975. Neal has been instrumental in planning for all three area conferences here and has served as the moderator and also as a topical speaker at each of them.

Breaking his ties here is something that Neal regrets doing, but he feels that his responsibilities are leading him to other places. Wherever he goes, Neal says, he will be participating as fully as possible in spreading the URANTIA Book teachings.
