# NEW YORK URANTIA SOCIETY?

There has been considerable movement in the New York City area recently toward the formation of a New York URANTIA Society. Following some informal discussions among members of the Manhattan and the Brooklyn-Queens study groups, two meetings were held in order to more formally examine the possibility of such an undertaking and consider its purposes.

The first meeting held on January 10, 1987, took place in the Manhattan home of Robin Jorgensen, where the Thursday night study group normally meets. Ten readers from various parts of New York City as well as Long island and New Jersey participated in a discussion focused on the reason for forming a society and on URAN-TIA Brotherhood requirements for doing so. Since the attendance level at that meeting was relatively low, it was regarded as preliminary in nature and the group decided to disseminate a summary of its proceedings to individuals in the New York area who may wish to participate in the process. A second meeting was called for March 1, 1987.

The March meeting was much better attended. Eighteen people showed up at Rick Brinkman's home in Queens, one of the sites of the Monday night study group. The level of enthusiasm among the participants seemed high; there was no doubt about the group's resolve to work toward the formation of a society and mechanisms were set in motion that day to achieve that goal.

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# 1987 GENERAL CONFERENCE OF URANTIA BROTHERHOOD FAST APPROACHING

### Site Coordinators Seeking Volunteers

The cards and registrations are rushing into URANTIA Brotherhood offices and everyone's prediction is proving correct: the upcoming international conference at Bowdoin College, Brunswick, Maine, will be very well attended. The conference theme, "Our Relationship with God: Personal Transformation and Its Power to Transform the World," already inspires the international group of conference organizers. A reprinted flyer is inserted in this issue of the USCC Newsletter, which has appeared in every recent issue of URAN-TIA Brotherhood Bulletin. Send a postcard to receive complete conference registration details.

The conference begins officially at 4 PM on Sunday, August 2, and continues through Friday afternoon, August 7. A pre-conference spiritual retreat has been organized by a group of readers and registration for this component begins the previous Friday afternoon, July 31. Further, many registrants are opting to stay at the college or in the area for the following weekend, August 7 - 9, for organizational meetings or just for fun.

The French translations of the registration materials were completed in March and are being sent upon request. The tireless volunteers creating these translations will be working up to and throughout the conference week to bring as much written and spoken material directly to French-speaking participants. At the conference electronic simultaneous translation will take place from English to French and other languages will be considered as more registrations are received.

A second on-site working session (35 volunteers met there last July) is planned for June 6 and 7 at Bowdoin College. You may have received more specific details already, but if you are free to attend, please join us. The Site Coordination Committee will be putting itself through a "dress rehearsal" to iron out problems and share ideas to improve our overall planning for August.

If you were waiting to find a way to be involved, now is the time to come forward and give back just a little of what you have been freely given in the past: the generous devotion of your friends in making each gathering of readers a special and memorable event. There is an unlimited need for Site Coordination Committee volunteers NOW. If you can give a few hours (or more) before the conference and/or can commit to a block of a few hours during the conference week, we will find something important for you to do. If you are between the ages of 13 and 18 your involvement is especially needed because teenagers so well bridge the generational gap, at once reminding us of our responsibilities of all who come after us and keeping our attitudes towards one another joyful, spirited, and spontaneous.

# "Australia is ever growing in the knowledge of the URANTIA revelation."

The following are excerpts from a letter from Leslie and Jo Thackwray, dated December 17, 1986, Kuranda, Queensland, Australia. Jo is an Australian citizen with family there and in the United States.

"... Things have been great. We got off our (bi)cycle trip about five months ago after traveling some 7500 kilometers around Aussie. We got to see the best of sights including Ayers Rock, The Olgas, and many more. We've conquered many miles with enduring physical stress, patience, courage, lack of stamina, and a times defeat in some of the mountain ranges. We're stronger than ever now and are ready to head back to the States for a new challenge: To cycle from Vancouver across Canada on Route 3 to Brunswick, Maine, for the international conference.

"We will be leaving here early in March for Bali for one month, Guam, Honolulu, L.A. ...

"... When we arrived up here in Kuranda there were no readers. Now there is a small community of about seven. Joe and I hold new reader study groups every two weeks and so far have sold ten books. There are people from all over the world that travel through Kuranda because of the markets where people get together and sell their goods; so we have sold a few books to people from other countries (too). At the moment we are slowly turning on a man from New Guinea who is very interested in the geographical parts (discussions of the book).

"It is so hard to keep (a supply of) books up here; there is no outlet so I have to order them from Melbourne and there are limited amounts down there. At times it's a bummer because so many have become interested...

"I have kept most of our study groups open to people's questions, helping them find those parts of the book that interest them most. It has been an incredible experience for us and we are ever thankful for being led here to further this epochal revelation...

"On our bicycle tour we made sure all our new friends would inquire about this big book we were pushing in our small packs on our bikes. We were able to inspire and give cheer to all we came into contact with. Jo and I love spreading this revelation together. We have become a strong unit in these last few years.

Australia is ever growing in the knowledge of the URANTIA revelation. Jo and I were able to travel to the major cities here visiting with various readers and attending study groups and gatherings. At the first conference we attended we gave a speech on the Boulder School and the movement across America. When we get to the 1987 conference in Maine we would like to do the same about the happenings here in Australia..."

A Divine Counselor has noted that the "religious challenge of this age is to those farseeing and forward-looking men and women of spiritual insight who will dare to construct a new and appealing philosophy of living out of the enlarged and exquisitely integrated modern concepts of cosmic truth, universe beauty, and divine goodness." (43:4)

Surely, the chance to study and disseminate the teachings of The URANTIA Book must count as an opportunity of a lifetime. It is an adventure in time and space that links us with the spiritual government ministering to our world.

As I see it, The URANTIA Book was given to our world as a planetary textbook, notwithstanding the fact that there are many other ways to know God and to know something about his divine plan. Our work in the URANTIA Brotherhood has a God-centered, planetary/universe orientation with scientific, philosophical, and religious concerns. If our efforts have, or will have, any particular and lasting significance it will be due to the degree we discern and act in truth upon the "Good News" presented so well in The URANTIA Book.

It seems to me that the desire to really learn and to spread the Fifth Epochal Revelation is the essential difference between the URANTIA Brotherhood and other organizations interested in God and man. Certainly, we are not in the business of prescribing the best way to discover God. Each individual mortal must find God personally for himself or herself through living faith. Rather, The URANTIA Book extends to God-knowing persons new and vital truths and facts about God the Father, his different universe levels and dimensions, this planet, and "the ennobling message of Michael, unencumbered by the accumulated doctrines and dogmas of nineteen centuries of contact with the religions of evolutionary origin," (1041:5) as expressed by a Melchizedek of Nebadon.

To be sure, the task before us is a difficult and exciting one. In my opinion, our number one priority at this time in history ought to be the establishment, maintenance, and expansion of thousands of study groups. By moving forward on a person-to-person basis, while building an ever-growing network of small groups, we can realistically expect to have at sometime in the future a leavening influence upon the evolutionary flow of human society. Let us strive to safe-guard this revelation, while we quietly spread the word. Do we dare do less in light of the past failures and partial successes of the first 4 planetary revelations.

We need always to remember that God commands the consequences of our actions. None of us can evaluate fully the true meaning of our lives. For example, even with the perspective he had at the end of his life, could the "young man who was afraid" (1437-1438) have guessed that almost two thousand years later we in the twentieth century would be reading about his uplifting encounter with Jesus? I am moved to consider what Jesus accomplished "as he passed by."

Patience, discretion, and trust in our unseen friends and allies will continue to serve us well in the work ahead. We are not alone in our labors. Undoubtedly, our organizational efforts have been, and will continue to be, aided by the scraphic Social Architects, who "do everything within their province and power to bring together suitable individuals that they may constitute efficient and agreeable working groups on earth . . But not always do these scraphim attain their ends; not always are they able to bring together those who would form the most ideal group to achieve a given purpose or to accomplish a certain task; under these conditions they must utilize the best of the material available." (432:7) Of course, we always have the opportunity to cooperate with the angels in the form of greater tolerance, understanding, and forbearance of fellow members of the URANTIA Brotherhood and URANTIA Foundation.

# STUDY GROUP PROFILES

### Jack Schmedes Reports from Cape Cod

The Cape Cod Fellowship for the Study of *The URANTIA Book* is our official collective appellation, but we are known as the Cape Cod Study Group and have been functioning as such since the spring of 1976.

At first we were meeting at a different residence for every meeting which soon became confusing for anyone who missed a meeting and unreliable as to which night and what time the meetings would be held. After two years of trials and changes, and in consideration of the nomadic nature of our Cape population, Sandy Rogers and I decided that in the interest of stability and continuity we should host the weekly study group at our home every Wednesday evening at 8 PM (except for vacations and/or illnesses), and we expect to continue doing this for the foreseeable future.

We spent a number of years reading with a variety of formats. We read selected papers chosen weekly at the meetings. We selected current issues and searched the book for pertinent material, and we read topically. All of the readers were relatively new to the book and whatever we read was challenging and interesting. But we found that without making the determination in advance no one was able to prepare or study for the next meeting, so we decided that reading a whole section sequentially would allow for preparation reading. We felt that we should try to complete a paper every week, and we found that frequently the meetings were running too late past 11 PM. Some felt that the discussion time during the reading of the paper was subordinated to the clock, so we decided to abandon the idea of a paper week and just 'let it happen.' We try to hold everyone to reading a section or about a page so that we all get a chance to read.

After about four years the group made the unanimous and momentous decision to read The URANTIA Book from cover to cover. It took us the next five years and seven months to accomplish that feat. We had a dinner party to celebrate that rewarding and edifying experience.

We have since read the first section again with much more in-depth discussions than the first time, and now have sort of an open format again. Of the nine members who made the decision to read the revelation from cover to cover, only four were still in the group when we finished. During those years we had numerous opportunities to digress for special occasions and for new seekers or friends to learn what our study group was like and to discover The URANTIA Book. Some did, and came back for varying periods of time. Others came randomly or seasonally, and still do. All know that there will be a meeting on Wednesday evening at 8. "Let the Spirit of Truth do his own work," is our watchword.

Currently there are four regular readers. Although our group has been as large as 28 on a few occasions, and we could expect from eight to twelve for periods of time, most generally we enjoy the fellowship of five or six. At times, we ponder the desirability of attracting new members and how that might be done. But we are somewhat reluctant to run out with a net or a hook to increase our ranks. We have discovered interesting viewpoints regarding the validity of such pursuits and practices.

The complexities of study groups are numerous and multi-leveled, Our experiences, during nearly eleven continuous years, seems to indicate that study groups are mis-named. In considering the appellation "study group," which is used to describe the multi-level weekly phenomena, brings me to the conclusion that the title is negative, misleading, and non-descriptive of the occasion. "Study" is a part of weekly function, but there is far more going on in our lives that is shared in the fellowship of the occasion.

### News from The Hempstead, New York, Group

The group was formed in the late 60s and while no one any longer comes from Hempstead (once known as the Hub of Long Island), tradition dies hard and we are loathe to change the name. Time has taken its toll in the intervening years and several of our members are now experiencing the morontia worlds, while the rest of us are gradually attaining the higher realms of senior citizens.

Our enthusiasm for The URANTIA Book is nonetheless undaunted as we cagerly await our twice-a-month meetings, and it is interesting to know how some of our group first encountered the book:

Hank Nowicki said that he and his wife, Dorothy, can't pass a Tag Sale, and at one there was this beautiful, brand new book on the table for \$4.00. They read the Table of Contents and when they saw the papers on the life and teachings of Jesus, Hank said that that was the clincher. They were ready for the book, Hank said, because they were members of the Association for Research and Enlightenment (the Edgar Cayce Foundation) and were convinced communication with supernal beings was highly credible.

Betty Towner's daughter was browsing through a large bookstore and came across the book. She thought it had unusual appeal and showed it to her mother. "That was the last time she saw the book," said Betty. "I couldn't put it down." Later, Betty's husband, Steve, a well-known and gifted artist, attended our group — not to read the book, he said, but as as a protector for his wife against what he thought might be potential "kooks." Gradually he became interested and was amazed how much he could relate The URANTIA Book to the teachings he received as he was growing up in the Ukrainian Orthodox Church. He now has a book of his own and Betty bought another book for her daughter.

Nat (now deceased) was a chiropractor and heard of the book from a patient, Peter Sarfaty (also deceased). Being open-minded and very receptive to new concepts, Nat bought the book but because of his busy practice, had no time to read it. Mildred, his wife, started reading and at mealtimes and odd moments would try to paraphrase and pass along to Nat the gist of the revelation. They both became well-informed readers. Mildred still attends our meetings.

Through Nat and Mildred, the book spread to John Scott, a fellow chiropractor, and he has remained a faithful member of our group.

Rhoda Van der Clute "found" the book in the dentist's chair. Between cotton balls, drills, scrapers, etc., she managed to speak about There Is A River, the well-written book of Edgar Cayee's life and his amazing "readings." The dentist's nurse (Helen Fleming) said, "if you think Edgar Cayee is so great, you should read the book I have. We're having a meeting in Connecticut, why don't you come?" That was in 1971 and "The URANTIA Book still has the same euphoric appeal as the day I acquired it at the Connecticut Regional Conference," said Rhoda. It was a foregone conclusion that Van, her husband (now deceased), and her mother, Rhoda (now a sprightly and alert 93), would become avidly interested.

Marie FitzPatrick is a newcomer to our Hempstead group and heard of the book when she was a "captive audience" in Rhoda's car for an hour-and-a-half. "Rhoda never stopped talking about it," recalled Marie, "and I just had to find out for myself what it was all about."

Amba, a lay preacher in Unity and a Yoga teacher, was introduced to the book by Hank and Dorothy. She says the concepts of The URANTIA Book are not hard for her to understand as she is predisposed to accept many of the revelations through their similarity to Unity's teachings. She often brings her friend, Agnes, to the meetings.

A consistently dependable time and place at which a number of the Father's children gather can become more like a spiritual event at a planetary way station than a study group. Reading and sharing the revelation together is usually the highlight of the meeting but the ten time, the talk and socialization time, is the more attractive drawing power which provides that which cannot be enjoyed elsewhere.

Discovering the uniqueness of personality, both our own and those with whom we share, is a very rewarding experience. We are all so different that it takes time to get to understand our sisters and brothers. Every relationship is a living entity that requires the nour-ishment of frequent contact and association in order to grow into the brotherly love our souls need to experience. Reading The URANTIA Book together becomes a bridge to the socialization process which is a morontia requirement that begins here and becomes finalized on Edentia. So, if you should find yourself on or near Cape Cod, we would truly enjoy your fellowship.

### The Brooklyn-Queens Group

The Brooklyn-Queens Study Group, "The Big Apple Corps," has been meeting regularly for about ten years. It budded in the spring of 1977 in the Flatbush section of Brooklyn and grew to include residents of Queens and Staten Island.

The Group meets every Monday on a rotating basis in participants' homes. Sections from The URANTIA Book are read sequentially and discussion is often lengthy.

### Cathy Winter's Look at The Watertown Group

We have a study group that meets on Friday nights as often as there are people who wish to attend. We met at our house in Watertown, although this is very flexible. We start at 7:30 PM. Although the group is small and fairly easy-going, we try to have a minimal structure; that is, we start (most times) with some kind of informal worship and then we read from The URANTIA Book. We started out with the idea of reading the book from the beginning, Due to various conflicts and some laziness in coordinating with everyone, we haven't had too many meetings in the last year. I have set a "rule" for the meeting; that is, if anyone who was not at the last meeting would like to attend a meeting, it is his/her responsibility to call me to express their interest and to make sure that a meeting is scheduled and where it is. I will not wait at my house on a Friday evening if no one is planning to come. (I have been burnt by that too many times!) But, if only one person wants to come to a meeting, barring any scheduling conflicts, there will be


