Upon reading an article in the June Reader's Digest, "The Healing Meadows of Memory", it was brought to me forcefully another reason why the above is the ultimate cruelty. Those helpless victims have no precious childhood memories. No storehouse of laid-up treasures.

On page 1779 Rodan tells us: "Train your memory to hold in sacred trust the strength-giving and worth-while episodes of life, which you can recall at will for your pleasure and edification. Thus build up for yourself and in yourself reserve galleries of beauty, goodness, and artistic grandeur."

Also when the soul of Jesus was tortured by baffled love and rejected mercy in the Garden of Gethsemane (1969), the book tells us that: "In this great sorrow his mind went back to the days of his childhood in Nazareth and to his early work in Galilee. At the time of this great trial there came up in



his mind many of those pleasant scenes of his earthly ministry. And it was from those old memories of Nazareth, Capernaum, Mt. Herman, and of the sunrise and sunset on the shimmering Sea of Galilee that he soothed himself as he made his human heart strong and ready to encounter the traitor who should so soon betray him."

And so these poor children have no chance to lay up for themselves memory treasures. Also no experience of a loving father to help them understand the love of God, our heavenly Father. It is indeed the ultimate cruelty.
