

Isaac Newton

Isaac Newton graces the covers for all *ILLUMINATIONS* issues this year. We find in him a noble representative of human scientific achievement, a symbol of one key component in the equation of science, religion and philosophy. We tend to think of him stereotypically as the one, whilst lazing under an apple tree one fine english summer day, who got bopped on the head with an apple and instantly uncovered the law of gravity. Actually, in his book <u>Principia</u> he layed down a virtual system of the universe incorporating gravity and the fundamental orbital curve of the ellipse. Jacob Bronowski said in <u>The Ascent of Man</u>, "As a system of the world, of course, it was sensational from the moment it was published. It is a marvelous description of the world subsumed under a single set of laws. But much more, it is also a landmark in scientific method... it is not until Newton that modern scientific method really begins to be rigorous."

In addition to the theory of universal gravity Newton invented calculus and made fundamental discoveries on the nature of light using prisms.

"I have often with admiration beheld that all the colors of the prism being made to converge, and thereby to be again mixed, reproduced light, entirely and perfectly white."

Our reading of *The URANTIA Book* has shown us that there is real harmony between science, religion, and philosophy. But haven't we often seen in this technological century a scientific arrogance and self-centeredness that would make it the spearhead in the pursuit of knowledge? Hasn't religion been condemned as nonverifiable and a relic from pre-renaissance days?

Yet Isaac Newton was a man who, near the end of his life could say: "I do not know what I may appear to the world; but to myself I seem only to have been like a boy, playing on the seashore, and diverting, myself, in now and then finding a smoother pebble or a prettier shell than ordinary, while the great ocean of truth lay all undiscovered before me."

Newton was a man who, like Einstein after him could ask profoundly simple questions. What his work showed is that when the answers are simple... then, too, perhaps, you hear God thinking.

Greetings from Vancouver,

The month of March was particularly interesting for the students of *The* URANTIA Book in the Vancouver/Victoria area. On March 3rd and 4th two members of the site selection committee, namely John Hales and Berkeley Elliott, for the URANTIA Brotherhood Triennial Conference, were in the Victoria/Vancouver area. On March 4th we were privileged to have them in the Vancouver area for a visit to the University of British Columbia. It is with great anticipation that we look forward to hearing from this committee because the Pacific Northwest is in the plans for the 1990 or 1993 brotherhood conference. The University of Victoria and the University of British Columbia are possible sites for this conference. This could mark the beginning of the first URANTIA Brotherhood conference outside of the United States.

Further to this story, we were delighted to find so many others also paying a friendly visit at this time. In all there were eleven visitors, ten from the U.S. and one from Victoria. In attendance were Berkeley Elliott, International Committee; John Hales, Secretary-General of URANTIA Brotherhood; John Lange, Charter Committee; Stephen Drier, Charter Committee; Thomas Allen, Domestic Extension Committee; Meredith and *Irene Sprunger, *Charter Committee. Also along for the trip and from Seattle were Inez Finstad, Mark French, Thomas Choquette, with Lenard Faller from Victoria. A get-together supper at a local cafe was planned for and took place shortly after this group looked over the meeting facilities at the University of British Columbia. Attending this supper were many of the long time URANTIA Book students from Vancouver and some recent newcomers to the group. Meredith Sprunger graciously gave thanks to our Father Christ Michael for the meal. The little precious time there was for fellowshiping with so many long time friends was greatly treasured by those in attendance. All the visiting guests were accommodated in suites at the Walter Gage Residence, University of British Columbia.

The next day on Saturday March 5th our friends left for Seattle where a charter ceremony took place to inaugurate the PILOT LIGHT URANTIA SOCIETY of SEATTLE. The master of ceremonies for the evening was the most efficacious Anthony Finstad, now the President of P.L.U.S.S. This was one of the great episodes of the Pacific Northwest and was well attended by invited and not so invited persons. By this I mean, if you can visualize about eighty persons gathered together in a large upper room on the quiet ocean's edge, in a semi-formal setting and late into the evening, as some were preparing to swear allegiance to our Heavenly Father to do his will in goodness through the mandates of a Society. Just before the formal presentations began there was a LOUD, window rattling, floor-shaking racket coming up from below this room. One wonders if it is an earthquake of the seraphic transport preparing to transport us to another planet! It was not long before we began to discover that this deafening noise would be with us to the end of the night. Little to anyone's prior knowledge did we know that we were to become sandwiched between the decadence of "muscle music" from below and the glories from on high above. However, this untimely scene was saved by the good-natured and humorous Hoite Caston (Trustee-URANTIA Foundation) who happened to be just about ready to deliver his speech, and as he so began, "he picked up the beat." And once again as God so wills it, we found ourselves learning "those lessons of patience, altruism, tolerance, and forbearance which are so essential to the realization of brotherhood among men." In his speech Lew Clark of Wenatchee compared our young society to a newly launched ship as it left port for thrilling voyages. TIME TO PONDER

Just think! In only six thousand five hundred and thirty eight years it will be an even one million years since this planet was proclaimed inhabited. Andon and Fonta were the first recognized humans. This momentous celebration takes place in the year 8526 A.D.

How far away is 6538 years? Can we conceive how human life will appear in the 86th century? To most of us the year 2000 A.D. looked far in the future and the year 3000 A.D. has only been speculated upon by the writers of science fiction. TRÜMMELBACH FALLS

The metaphor of water and spirit is certainly not a novel idea to the human mind. Countless people have seen in water and its interaction with the natural world a variety of spiritual meanings and connotations. Jesus himself used the analogy when speaking of the waters of the Living Spirit springing up to eternal life and also of the forthcoming spirit of truth so soon to be poured out upon this planet. Years ago this idea was brought to me most graphically by way of a slide-tape created by a friend of mine, Jamie Wakefield, through a series of images set to "water music". He showed the gradual progression of water from mountain top snow and ice as it melted and meekly began its journey to the sea. Quickening into rivulets and streams it cascaded with ever increasing power and glory through an infinity of paths to its eventual reunion with itself. The music of the quickening water sang a song of the eventual triumph of the spirit.

The Lauterbrunnen valley in central Switzerland is a stunning natural achievement. Surely it must be the archetype for all U-shaped glacial valleys. Set beneath the famed alpine summits of the Jungfrau and the Eiger, Lauterbrunnen boasts sheer vertical granite walls which suddenly yield to the pastoral valley floor. And herein lies a great secret to alpine charm: The warm interaction of man with the environment. Alaska, for example, is no less a spectacular natural wonderland, a host to unbelievable beauty. It, however, is so vast and so newly a part of our collective conciousness. As western man runs out of frontiers to dominate, he interacts feverishly with the beauty. Indeed, the Alaskan land is so great and extensive that it takes on a lonely quality.

The Alps, on the other hand, sport charming 1,000 year old towns, the varied stamps of many types of people amidst all the richness that a farming environment provides. On the Lauterbrunnen valley floor you can hear the haunting melodies of countless cowbells as an elderly woman bicycles home from town. Outdated toy-like tractors slowly work the land as the mountains vault overhead.

Certainly this natural beauty is augmented by man's graceful presence and from that union emerges a cozy, beckoning warmth.

Oh, to burrow deep within it as would a child snuggling and squirming to reach the bottom of the bed.

The Michelin Green Guide, which is always right, gives the valley three stars. A three star location is a must see; two are virtually as good, and there is interest aplenty in any place sporting one star. Most locales don't get any at all. Trummelbach Falls, we were told, also has three stars and as we traversed the valley floor we expected at any moment to see the grandest water fall of all time cascading thousands of feet down into the valley amidst a roar reminiscent of invading vandals and huns. Surely the glaciers of the Jungfrau would join to produce a waterfall equal to the majesty of the valley.

Nothing.

We parked, paid our 2 francs to the little man, and walked right up to the sheer vertical wall of the valley over which, if I were a waterfall, I would be plummeting.

Still nothing.

"Well, it is Friday. Maybe they turn off the waterfalls in Switzerland on Friday. Exactly what is going on here? Do we have to climb out of the valley and see this thing half way up the mighty Jungfrau?"

In Switzerland, never does one have to toil for long to see its magnificent sights. The Swiss have built a variety of rack-railways and cable cars to take tourists to places previously thought totally inaccessible. In this case, a strange combination of elevator and railway takes you 400 feet up inside the valley wall at a 45 degree angle to where the real action is.

For, you see, Trummelbach Falls is not all that far away. It is merely working in concealment, tucked neatly away from the valley.

What a spectacular series of swirled chambers has been created here inside the valley wall! Here at last, pouring right our at your feet is the great white cascade, now deafeningly loud. Follow a foot path, itself carved out of the rock, climb stairs through dank tunnels away from the tumult and, suddenly, the falls reappear in a completely different chamber. The swirled etchings in the rock indicate exactly how and where the falls coursed in years passed. Look up only and only a tiny crack of

light reminds you that the waterfall is slicing its way, most laser-like, into the heart of the stone.

This waterfall has created its own set of private rooms and when you go inside to visit there is no doubt as to what is going on. Its water versus rock and the excitement tops that of a decade full of wrestlemanias and superbowls. Water is winning this confrontation and its doing so with an odd mixture of raw power and graceful finesse. With the help of those pragmatic Swiss we can see the competition up close and personal.

When one compares the solid properties of rock and stone with the fluidity of water, there is simply no way that the liquid could ever erode the stone. But put time and gravity on the water's side and it will always triumph, no matter the odds. Man has seen this everywhere, be it in common peaceful river valleys eroded over the ages, or more spectacularly in raging rivers and falls. In each case the spiritual metaphor is similar. The spirit-water, allied with time and gravity, will always triumph whether it encounters a tragic and fearful planet or a vast unsettled universe.

Trummelbach Falls teaches this eternal lesson of water with great authority but the lessons it offers go even further. If you didn't know the falls were right there you'd have missed them. And being already amazed by the great glacial valley, you'd probably feel there was no need to look beyond. How many times have we met someone and quickly categorized them as being this or that sort of person? How easy it is to label seemingly unstimulating personalities as ordinary, possessing a lack of depth. Let's face it, sometimes its true. "Look again. You just might find, neatly hidden, the spectacular inner workings of the spirit." Its not unlike taking one of those bland little rocks, cleaving it in half, and seeing inside a spectacular array of crystals. Great is the joy of finding unexpected treasure.

Going back again to the valley, the falls quickly recede from eye and ear. But here at home, many thousands of miles away, I can hear the falls buried in stone. I can see with greater clarity that truth, beauty, and goodness may turn up in the oddest of places. And I thrill to the music of the Trummelbach water as it joins in the great, ever-growing chorus -- singing the song of the triumph of the Spirit.


