In 1992, I found myself in Sweden, in cold Scandinavia. I left Bosnia with relief, leaving behind the graveyard of the Balcans with its war and destruction. As I relaxed, I started to unpack my luggage. I had left my home with one suitcase only, but with much baggage. One was labeled Fears, another labeled Confusion, and a third labeled Who am I and what am I doing? I was lost in my Prayers, with no clear idea to whom I was praying.

One evening I went to the Depot called "Magasinet," an old railway storage that served as a youth center. There I met a couple—Sandy and Christel Garrick, making preparations to start a choir. "What will it be called?" I asked. "POEGWAM," they said, "An Acronym for Peace On Earth and Good Will Among

Men."

I was skeptical, I have to admit. I knew that there certainly was something more than things we could touch and see, but what was it all about? Psychology, maybe, or some metaphysics; it never occurred to me that this other reality had to do with religion. Religious affiliations were greatly discouraged in my country. religion was expression of fear, a refuge for weak, primitive reasoning that could not be rescinded, but was destined to extinction as humanity progressed. For the last couple of years, as religious institutions in my country awakened, they called people into war, in the name of "God and nation."

Watching these two people, I realized that there was some unshakable fundament, beyond their works, something different from what I have seen. Their acts were based on much love, reflection, understanding, patience and compassion. Finally I dared to ask, "what is religion?" "It is sharing your inner life with God," they answered. This shook the fundaments of my being.

The choir grew and we soon numbered twenty, often more. There I met Saed, an Iranian Kurd, my present husband. The Garricks and the two of us soon started studing The URANTIA Book. Only to those who asked, did they tell. Many others never found out that some big blue book bolstered this act of love. They learned of its principles and cheerfully about kindness, compassion, and patience. We prayed a lot together and we did it with humor and from the bottom of our hearts. The Garricks always reminded us to thank God for His fragment that lives within us, that leads us and draws us closer to Him.

The rehearsals were something we all looked forward to and something that enriched our lives, that drew all the best from our experiences and beliefs, different cultural backgrounds and faiths. "The name of the Father," one of the songs from their repertoire said, "What's the difference what you call the name of the Father, Allah, Budda, Elohim, Yehova, they are the same loving Father." We sang in churches, senior centers and hospitals.

My subsequent study of The URANTIA Book didn't take my negative baggage away, but it made it easier for me to sort through, for I knew I wasn't alone. It answered many of my questions, and gave rise to new questions. It opened horizons I never dreamed of.

I believe in movements such as POEGWAM as I see how positively it touched the lives of all of us who joined it. This planet needs the simple acts of kindness that will, with the simplicity of messages, break the barriers of nations and creeds. As Sandy said, "This is the message that doesn't argue with any religion or creed, rather adheres to what united all prophetic thought of all ages. Peace On Earth and Good Will Among Men could (should) turn out to be a saving grace of all mankind, through the universal language-music."

UPDATE: Today as I am writing this, I have received news that Sandy Garrick has departed to the mansion worlds. I can't believe it. I see him sitting at the kitchen table, cigaret in his hand, The URANTIA Book in front of him, and laughing. He called me "daughter," when I first met him and always after. As a refugee myself, I have found Sandy

as living proof that one can come out of genocide with love, faith, and optimism.

Born in Hungary, under the threat of the Jewish holoucaust, as a thirteen-year-old, Sandy embarked on a NATO ship and escaped to Canada. He lived in a dozen countries all over the world (Sweden, England, Germany, Australia, Japan, USA, . . . ). As a professional musician, he conducted orchestra, played and recorded music, and together with his loving wife and children, lived everywhere a life of friendship and love.

His approach to the divine was through music and humor. The minister in one of the churches where Sandy conducted a gospel choir said, "What I have learned from Sandy is to laugh, to take myself and religion easy, with humor and song." For those of you who knew him, Sandy died without pain, with a big hamburger and cola in his hands, and with a complaint—they were not as good as those in New York. "I lived a most charming life," were his last words.

Anyway, this morning I decided to put an end to my misery by heaping all the single and mateless orphans into a mountain in the middle of the living room floor and turn them into a lovely bonfire. Mark came strolling in, looking for his oatmeal, to see me crouching there, lighter fluid in one hand and matches in the other.

"STOP!", he shouted, wrestling my weapons away from me. "Don't you remember what The URANTIA Book says?" I was pulled out of my temporary derangement. Just long enough to think there was NO way on earth that he was going to be able to use the book to explain me out of my bonfire. But he did! It's really in there! 

#### "A PARLIAMENT OF SOULS"

In Search of Global Spiritually
Edited by Michael Tobias, Jane Morrison,
and Bettina Gray

Out of the second Parliament of the World's Religions, held in August of 1993 in Chicago, came a TV series on the world's religions and this book which is a companion to the Public Television Series. Bettina Gray, a long time student of The URANTIA Book, interviewed 28 spiritual leaders from around the world, participated in making a TV series which is currently being shown, and edited this book, which is invaluable to any student of The URANTIA Book who wants to know about our planet's spiritual paths. Bettina asked these world religious leaders such questions as: Who are we? From whence we came? Is there a purpose to our being? Is there truly free will? Is there life after death? Is there a God?

Leaders from Buddhism, Christian, Hinduism, Jainism, Judaism, Islam, Sikhism, Taoism, Confucian, and etc., give their own personal answers to these questions. In most cases what is being offered is a personalized view of their own particular path, and not just the traditionized dogma. For example, His Holiness the Dalai Lama (Tenzin Gyatso) representing Buddhism, says about love and compassion: "It is not only the sense of close feeling person the OF toward community, but there is also the sense of responsibility or sense of commitment. Also genuine compassion is not based on personal good, something close to me, but rather on that the other person or other community also has the same experience just like myself. They also want happiness and do not want suffering. On the basis of the realization of oneness as human brothers and sisters, we can develope genuine respect for their rights, genuine concerns about their future. That is genuine compassion." (page 63 of this book)

These leaders become very real and personable as you read what they say about their paths. #### Readers of The URANTIA Book gather at the Pacific School of Religion on May 6, 1995

On broad lawns of the Pacific School of religion (PSR) campus, offering a panoramic view of San Francisco and the bay with the Golden Gate Bridge spanning its waters, beckon invitingly to lovers, learners and sun-worshipers alike. And they were just as ideal and pleasing a site for The URANTIA Book readers who gathered on May 6th under the sponsorship of the Golden Gate Circle to also seek love, knowledge and light of a higher kind. Many long-time students from Marin, San Jose, Contra Costa, Alameda, and San Francisco Counties, joined with newer readers from Hawaii, Bosnia, and the study group recently formed at Walnut Creek's Unity Church, among others.

After welcoming remarks by "Circle" Vice President, Stephen Zendt, and a song bravely rendered on guitar by yours truly, Sara Blackstock opened the day with a reading of the paper given by Carol Hay at the 1995 Science Symposium which had been inspired by Margaret Wheatley's book Leadership in the New Science.

Wheatley's idea is that a new paradigm of organizational structure is replacing the pyramid structure still favored by todays corporate systems which was designed to resist fluctuation and change. Yet orderly management of change, the idea that chaos helps a system to

thrive, is the way by which we can navigate organizations through the future, especially now that, "The social ship has steamed out of the sheltered bays of established tradition." (UB page 1086) We can find implications for ourselves within the movement, focussing less of our anxious energy on the war of words and paper that has gone on between Foundies and Feffies over the last few years since the voices calling for change were first raised. Under the new paradigm Wheatly discusses, a system, through a kind a self-referencing similiar to the way skin rebuilds skin from the messages encoded within DNA, finds the way to reconstruct itself in those times of change that cause so much apparent destruction. The need to contribute our messages, our random fluctuations, is crucially important to the reconstruction of a healthy system under the emerging perspective of the new paradigm, just as The URANTIA Book calls on us to be independent and courageous thinkers, not conforming to the rigid expectations of systems currently in place.

There followed a group discussion on who we are becoming as a readership. The appealing idea of working with representatives of the Foundation (IUA) was raised. Although the avenue seems not to be open at this time, we agreed on the importance of maintaining a channel of communication there. Becky Kantor, soon to be a student on the PSR campus, told us of the



challenges she faces being a known student of The URANTIA Book and she looked to us, the established readership, for support this experience. Our affiliation with the book can put us on the odd sides of certain fences. On the PSR campus, for example, the cutting edge of theology is at times represented in those who seek to demonstrate a thesis that Christ was not a divine Son. It may be that The URANTIA Book readers and along Baptists, with others fundamentalist sects, may find themselves standing up together to vouch for the divine nature of the Master from Galilee, in the same ironic fashion that we may fall into the camp of the Creationists (or be viewed that way by scientists who refuse to accept any role for creation within their idea of the evolutionary plan).

During the discussion Dolores Nice described how in her experience working with the Whole Life Expo Urantia Book booth in April, she met many people who'd had The URANTIA Book on their shelves for two-three or more years but hardly read it. One of our missions would appear to be guiding people into how to read the book and helping them negotiate its difficulties!

I sometimes discern a common thread running through the comments of Steven Zendt and others that binds us in agreement as to the emergency nature of the Book's mission. This recurring theme moved some to express the thought that perhaps we need to worry less about who we are and concern ourselves more with getting

out into the world and being who we already are for all the world to see. (PAGE 2084)

David Kantor's wonderful slide presentation on the many new archaeological discoveries in Israel showed us how these recent finds are changing our perspective on Jesus' life. Among the excavation projects reported in his program were: the unearthing of a Galilean fishing boat built right around the time of Jesus; the three concentric circles of El-Hiri which actually predate Melchizedek and Abraham's time; and the dig at Sephorris, the former Roman capital of Galilee. David's slides vividly demonstrated how near these mounds Sephorris, stillbeing excavated, to the hill behind Nazareth which Jesus most likely used for his regular sessions of worship. This city built by Herod was within easy walking distance of Nazareth, making Jesus' home town more likely to be a dynamic suburb than a pastoral backwater, and putting Jesus at the cultural crossroads of his age as The URANTIA Book confirms. Not only was he the Good Shepherd, master of the religious knowledge of his culture, but he was also conversant in the philosophy and science of his time and place, as we have seen from the picture of him that emerges in the pages of the revelation. The day ended with a beautifully staged remembrance supper of the Master. Many left the Berkeley campus refreshed and energized with many new ideas to consider as we continue to take this book out into the world for all truth seekers to enjoy.
